Putting a son or daughter (or both) through college these days calls for some serious thought as to where the money is coming from. You should investigate all sources: business and industry, state and local governments, colleges and universities, civic, fraternal and religious groups. Scholarships average around \$300 yearly. Deferred payment loans through the Connecticut Higher Education Assistance Corporation (CHEAC) are available to qualified students through cooperating banks.

STUDENT EARNINGS-Part-time work at college can earn as much as \$300. Summertime and vacation employment can account for \$300-800. Check the Student Placement Bureau at the college of your choice.
