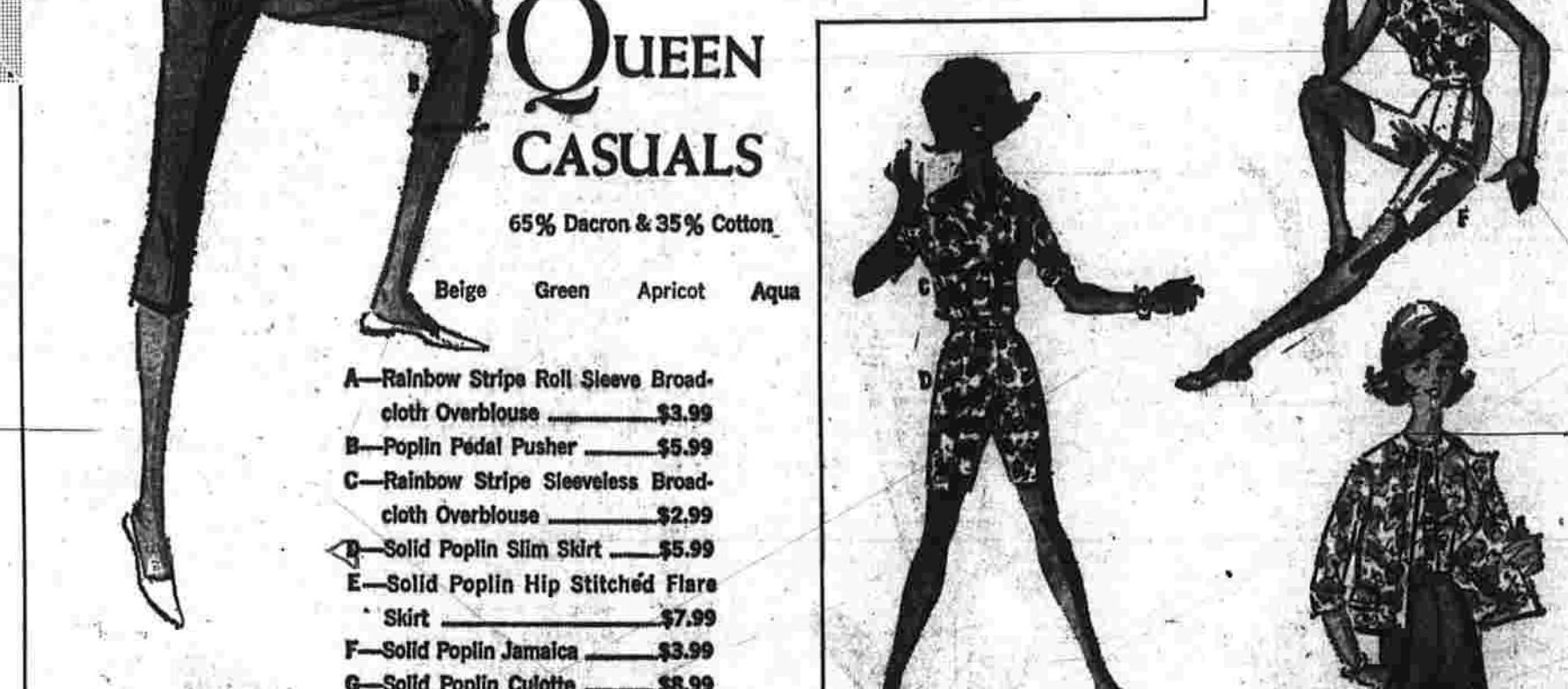

For the Democrats, the recent primaries over state convention delegates might have brought resolution of conflict, but didn't. They might have left John Bailey and Abe Ribicoff little more than custodial duties for the state convention. They might have resigned that since little fellow, Congressman-elect, Frank Kowalski, from the giant-billed competition which is upon him.

The primaries could have done all this neatly enough.

But, in the perverse richness of the free democratic system of life sometimes insists upon having for itself, the primaries really refused to call anything done for anybody.

Congressman Kowalski, taking New Britain, was enough to keep him in the attitude of militant challenger without adding very substantially to his actual strength.

Secretary Ribicoff, losing in New Britain, but winning in Waterbury, found the primaries a state-wide experience probably far removed from the actual delegate situation in the state. His lack of success, it seems almost completely would be largely psychological, an unreal sense of political insecurity nagging and nipping at his rear portion of power.

There was some minor devilment in the result, too. Ribicoff, losing his home city, might well have blamed ethnic voting patterns which handed a frank victory to Kowalski. And this would still conceivably be the main explanation of the result in New Britain. Unfortunately, however, another Kowalski victory took place in the town of Colchester where, if voting had followed ethnic lines, Ribicoff would have been the winner. For Ribicoff to lose the ethnic vote for New Britain, then, would merely give Kowalski the chance to add vote, if ethnic voting was as decisive, the result in Colchester hadn't been different.

So, because New Britain was the Ribicoff home city, and Colchester a community of a certain racial tinge, the Kowalski victory was to be allowed to loom a little larger than it may really have been, and the little challenger, who obviously needed more than a stalemate to get going anywhere, nevertheless manages to keep going on a stalemate. In fact, so far as he is concerned, considering how long he has stayed in the ring without too much seconding of any kind, he probably does feel that the primary results constitute a mandate, a veritable mandate, for his continuance of his fight.

The fact that Kowalski is such a madman fellow as to read material from stalemate is at once a madman fellow as to read material which will be humbled, he who humbles himself will be exalted." The federal grant funds would be increased to 80 per cent except in areas of unusual economic distress, where they could go up to 90 per cent. Loans would be available for cities unable to meet their share of the cost.

The standby program for the same type of projects would be triggered if national unemployment rose 1 per cent in not less than three nor more than nine months, and if the jobless level was above 7 per cent.

What One Leaves

The world, at this time, is all in the new verdure and foliage; this is the moment, never to come again until another May, when everything is at once fresh and full.

But it is, by these same tokens, something of the unique psychological moment, too.

We doubt seriously that there is any season of year which can make life seem more precious, more priceless, more beautiful.

That makes it also, then, the supreme moment for remembering and honoring those who no longer share and breathe with us this air of wine.

This, around us, is that death forsakes what death is not.

This, around us, is what those we honor marched away from, because they had to, because, among their computations, there was one which said "at some things were even more precious and priceless than life."

This is indeed the season of year at which the green of our foliage, the colors of the flag, the slantings of the sun, and the sentiments of men all give off the brightest and clearest and most unforgettable glints. This is how beautiful life on this earth can be. This is what one leaves when one goes.

Since there have to be going, it is good there are bugles, to make a brave and stirring sound, and good there are uniforms, so we does not feel alone, and good there can be a Memorial Day, so that those who mourn need never do so alone. And this, the cruelty of this extraordinary May beauty symbolizing what death really means, is what we, the living, deserve to have thrust deep into our sensitivities, until we invent, some day, the kind of bugles which can blow peace.

Fear Closed Higher

Fear is not a good element in any part of the nation's living. It chases reason out of its way; it provokes contagion; it can stampede things in one corral, it may leap into another.

And that, of course, was the disturbing thing about the behavior of the stock market yesterday.

For most of us, the stock market is something we can take or leave. For the nation as a whole, it is more of an exciting side-show in the nation's economy than any important central function. Those who try to play the game of getting rich do so at their own risk of profit or loss. The mere advance or decline of prices on the stock market does not make or break America.

But a stock market which succumbs to a mob fear can have an effect on America which goes beyond its own speculators.

There could be many acceptable explanations for the recent behavior of the market, culminating, one hopes, in the new decline yesterday. It could be, as one of the President's economists says, that the American economy is at last beginning to realize that inflation is not going to go on with its gay ride forever.

It could be that there are too many prospects of peaceful aversion of crisis in the world, so that no great war crisis looms up to stampede us out of our present stand against more inflation.

It could be that recent disclosure of some financial bubbles, not in Texas alone, have injured public confidence in the honesty of our corporate processes.

It could be that a good many

Among Other Weaknesses

A group of members of the House Foreign Affairs Committee has submitted to the committee a whole report on the Southeast Asia Treaty Organization which finds that the alliance known as SEATO "offers no security" to the nations of Southeast Asia.

The report of these good Congressmen, however, concentrates on some faults in SEATO and neglects of others. It attacks, for instance, the requirement of the treaty which says there must be an unanimous vote by all its members before it takes action of any kind. It attacks, again, the attitude of two of the alliance members, Britain and France. "Neither," says their report, "has shown any inclination to become militarily involved in that area to combat Communist encroachments."

These investigating Congressmen seem to have the idea that the United States, too, might have given the alliance more positive and dynamic leadership.

But it is not, of course, the lack of military belligerence on the part of France, Britain and the United States which is the crucial weakness of this pitiful "Southeast Asia" alliance. It is that France, Britain, and the United States are its leading and dominant members.

Two other members, Australia and New Zealand, may be Asia in geographical proximity, but are Western in population. That leaves a minority of Pakistan, Thailand and the Philippines to represent Asia in this regional alliance for Southeast Asia.

It would be something comparable if France, Britain and Germany should join with Bermuda, Martinique, Argentina, Guatemala and British Guiana in organizing an alliance for the protection of Southeast America.

The real nonsense of SEATO is that it doesn't represent the very area, the very people, it is supposed to defend.

It has that nonsense in addition to the routine nonsense which is involved in all such regional pacts, even when they do happen to be legitimate from the point of view of geography. The world is shrinking in size to the point where even the division caused by a good alliance can wind up fatal fissure.

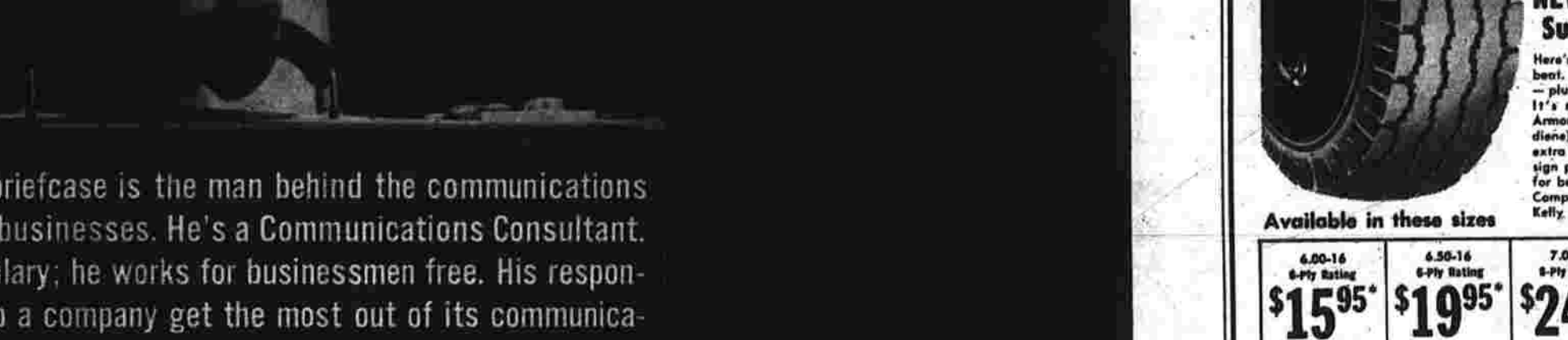

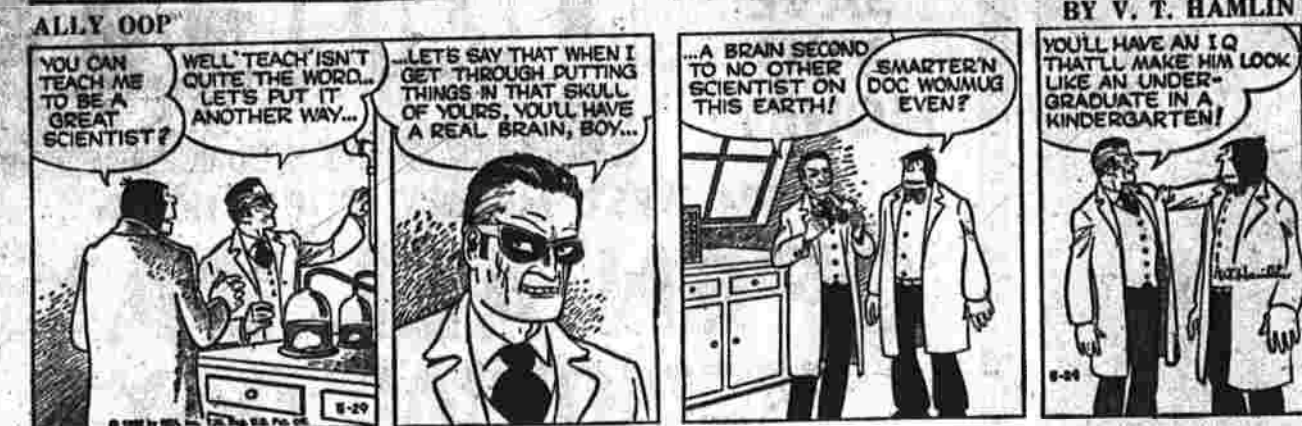

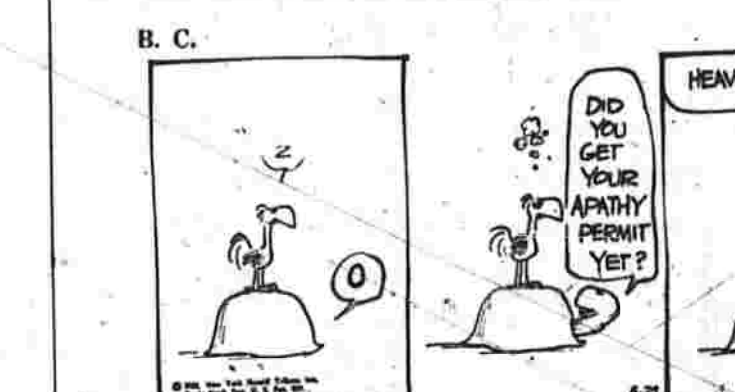

The final plan for guiding the future development of the region in all likelihood won't exactly be like any of the individual alternatives proposed by the Capital Region Planning Agency says CRPA regional planner Robert W. Chave.

"We expect the final plan might be some fusion of two or three of the alternatives proposed in last year's CRPA report which would represent a consensus of the various towns on the future development of the area," Chave added.

In effect, what this means is that the ultimate regional plan decided on probably will be a composite of the linear, satellite and balanced alternatives listed in the CRPA report, said Chave.

Two other alternatives for regional development also were suggested by the CRPA: The existing zoning plan and the strong center plan (emphasis on the City of Hartford as the focal point around which the region will develop).

The strong center plan has pretty much dropped out of favor, Chave indicated, adding, however, that the final composite plan could incorporate significant elements of the existing zoning scheme. Incorporation of the strong center plan seems unlikely, Chave felt.

Briefly, the linear alternative features most of the development along the Connecticut River valley, the satellite alternative would provide for several small cities in the region, the balanced plan would endeavor to have industry located in all the regional towns as a means of helping offset the tax burden.

Third Year on Staff

Chave, who lives at 20 Packard St. in Manchester, is in the process of rounding out his third year on the CRPA staff since he started work with the organization in September 1960.

Prior to his appointment on the CRPA staff, Chave was doing graduate work for two years at the University of California, Berkeley, Calif., where he received his master's degree in city planning.

Before taking his master's work, Chave registered for such background courses in design and the history of architecture for a half-year at the University of California.

His other formal schooling was taken at Dobbs Ferry High School, Chave was named to the National Honor Society and played the forward and center positions on the high school varsity basketball team.

After graduating from Kent University, Chave worked as a cartographer for the U.S. Army Map Service for a half-year in Washington, D. C., then joined the Army Air Force in late 1952.

He took his pre-flight training and basic flight training around the Pensacola, Fla., area under the Naval Cadet Training Program.

He later was commissioned an aviator, then advanced to the rank of lieutenant junior grade, a rank
