

HARTFORD (AP)-Horace Seely-Brown Jr., a plain-talking, apple-growing congressman from eastern Connecticut, has won the Republican nomination for U.S. Senator from

Seely-Brown, 54, scored a stunning upset over former Gov.

John Davis Lodge yesterday at a dramatic Republican state
convention. Although the pre-convention underdog, he
swamped Lodge on the first ballot, 476 to 149. John Alsop of Avon, an insurance executive, received the gubernatorial nomination earlier in the day after a record eight roll calls that began Tuesday afternoon.

The delegates also broke another tradition by nominating he first Negro for a statewide office in Connecticut on the ticket of either party. William D. Graham, a 47-year-old attorney who was born in Montgomery, Ala., was nominated for state treasurer without opposition.

Although the convention completed a state ticket to con-front the Democrats this fall, Republicans are in for some more excitement in the next few days. Both Lodge and Edwin H. May Jr., a defeated guberna-torial hopeful, polled enough votes to challenge the conven-

ion nominees in statewide party primaries.







Biggest Cut in Budget Comes in Instruction

The board of education last night tentatively snipped out \$327,459 from its 1962-63 school budget to reduce the \$4,814,024 budget it had originally requested to the \$4,486,565 it had finally been granted.

The bigrest cuts came out of instruction, where \$160,760 which pers and supplies allocations were would have gone for salaries for additional teachers was eliminated, and in malnemance of plant, the traditional area for budget reductions, which was lowered by \$35,514.

Other major cuts were in capital outlay, \$47,820, and in fixed charges, which the board decided neendn't be, and removed \$29,500. Within the lost sum in the latter category were \$12,000 for major medical insurance payments for all school system employes and \$13,000 for half-payment of Blue Cross and Connecticut Medical Service costs.

Capital outlay, where \$57,185 was originally allocated, included funds for a \$15,000 language laboratory at Manchester High School and 14 television sets to begin on a limited scale the inschool programs of the new Channel 24 educational television station. Of the original figure, \$9,235 remains.

Operation of school plant dropped from \$529,681 to \$511,551.
