Strategy for Prosperity Income Tax Cut Jan. 1 Proposed by Kennedy

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Kennedy today announced a strategy for prosperity on a five-point tax package that includes across-the-board income tax cuts starting next January.

"There is no need for this country to watch a recovery run out of gas," Kennedy declared in a news conference Thursday.

"We have a program to boost it and I hope that all those who are concerned about their stocks or their profits in other ways will help us get action on this program," he added.

"This inviting public support, including support from critics who contended administration policies upset the stock market, Kennedy urged Congress to get down to business quickly on his proposals. Tax cuts highlighted the news conference in which Kennedy snapped back at critics who contended the administration does not intend to recommend an immediate cut in income taxes. But he said he will not recommend a return bill providing reductions in both personal and corporate income taxes effective July 1, for congressional action next year. Details are being worked out, he said, but will result in a net loss to the Treasury of \$10 billion, probably will not be satisfied this year. The stock market decline

Integrity, Accuracy Editors Propose Code For Good Newspapers

RICHMOND, Va. (AP)—A committee of veteran editors has proposed a new code to help the public and press determine what makes a good newspaper. It stresses integrity, accuracy, responsibility and leadership as the basic elements of a quality paper. The code, tentatively named "Criteria of a Good Newspaper," results from 18 months of extensive research and study by a committee of the Associated Press Managing Editors Association. It represents the first broad-scale professional attempt ever made to establish such a code. The idea was conceived two years ago by J. Edward Murray, managing editor of the Atlanta Republic and then president of the association. The committee of editors was selected to handle the project with John H. Colburn, managing editor of the Richmond Times Dispatch, as chairman. Other members were Frank E. Perry, managing editor of the Des Moines Register and Tribune; Vincent S. Jones, executive editor of the Cincinnati Enquirer; James J. Pope, until recently executive editor of the Louisville Courier-Journal and Times; J. Montgomery Curtis, director of the American Press Institute; and Murray. Guidelines for Public. Their assignment was to establish criteria that would enable a good newspaper to judge its own performance and give the public a guideline to give its community paper. Colburn says the code, still subject to refinement before its final adoption, now embodies the suggestions of nearly 500 editors, publishers and the heads of 12 journalism schools. "It is only now ready for examination, criticism and revision by newspapermen at large," he added. "We hope to see suggestions for its improvement from the profession as a whole."
