Radiation detectors, and obstacles met by booster rockets are on the scene.

For instance, a new device resembling an over-sized fountain pen (called a "straw" detector) has been developed by R. H. Durr and C. J. Borowski of the Oak Ridge National Laboratory. This detector will detect radiation levels as low as one-tenth of a millirem per hour.

Each year, millions of Americans are exposed to radiation from the Gulf Stream, the Atlantic Ocean, and the West Coast. The Gulf Stream, which flows northward from the Gulf of Mexico, carries warm water from the tropics to the North Atlantic. This warm water causes the air above it to rise, creating clouds and precipitation. The West Coast, on the other hand, is cooled by the California Current, which carries cold water from the North Pacific to the West Coast. This cold water causes the air above it to sink, creating a high-pressure system that inhibits cloud formation and precipitation.

Andover Town Vote on Revaluation, Dump Agreements Slated

The selectmen have called a special town meeting Saturday at 8 p. m. at the Town Hall to act on the proposal for revaluation of properties on the grid list.

The meeting will determine if a sum not to exceed \$2,000 shall be appropriated to cover costs of the revaluation, and if that amount shall be transferred from the contingency fund. The meeting will be held to empower the assessors to enter into a contract with an appraised firm for the revaluation, and to provide office space. The town will vote on establishing a land value committee of not more than five members to confer and consult with the assessors and the appraisal firm in connection with the revaluation.

Other items in the evening deal with the Andover Disposal Area. The town will vote to determine whether the selectmen shall be authorized to enter into a contract with the Vermont and Rockwell to use the disposal area for one year for not less than \$2,000.

A separate item deals with the question of authorizing a contract with Hebron for use of the disposal area for one year for not less than \$2,000.

Items regarding amending the ordinance adopted at the annual meeting a month ago for the regulation of the disposal area, and increasing the appropriation for maintenance of same to enable selectmen to carry out provisions of the ordinance will also be considered.

Another item is to see if the town will vote that property taxes of \$50 or less shall be paid in a single payment. The current figure for a single payment is \$40.

Mousley Leaves District Post For Pastorate in Venezuela

The Rev. Harvey K. Mousley of Bolton, superintendent of the North District of the Methodist Church, will leave next week to assume a pastorate in Venezuela.

The district superintendent's appointment to Venezuela was announced at the 133rd annual conference of the New England Southern Conference which will convene to meet from through Sunday at Washington College in North, Mass.

The Rev. Mr. Mousley will become pastor of Christ Church, an interdenominational church in Caracas, Venezuela, under the sponsorship of the National Council of Churches. The district superintendent has held that post for more than five years. There is a six-year limit for assignments as district superintendent. The Rev. Mr. Mousley had sought the transfer at this time since his interest in a foreign assignment and the opportunity in Venezuela coincided.

The Mousley family will leave this area soon after completion of the conference to visit their daughter and grandchildren in South America.

The superintendent is a graduate of the Union Theological Seminary, although his work is not in the mission field, will involve English speaking persons for the most part.

Christmas Island and released the equivalent of from one to several million tons of TNT. This was the 17th—and one of the largest—amounts of atomic energy released in U.S. test series.

The new Soviet ship was identified as the A. I. Voznyakov, a six-berth ship of the Soviet navy, which took up stations during May.

Since the Voznyakov displaced about 2,800 tons and is equipped with extensive scientific instrumentation.

Although the Pentagon gave no details, it was obvious the Navy has been keeping tabs on the Soviet snooper fleet. Because the Russians are in international waters, there is nothing this country can do to show them away.

Normally, in an operation of this sort, the Navy assigns at least one ship to shadow Soviet craft. Sometimes it is a destroyer, sometimes a submarine. No effort is made to hide from the Russians, officials said.

Among other things, the Voznyakov is understood to be fitted with a pad for launching meteorological rockets to study the effects of nuclear explosions on the upper atmosphere.

The Defense Department has said radiochemical analysis by the Brookhaven 16 laboratories could provide information on bomb design, yield, and similar data which have significant military implications.

Indications are the Soviet fleet will have another shot to monitor before the big atmospheric burst Joint Task Force 4 on Monday ordered the danger area around Christmas Island closed to pilots and navigators.

Rockville Vernon One Mill Tax Cut Foreseen For District

A one-mill tax cut for the Vernon Fire District was seen as a likely prospect last night at a district meeting. Letting the tax to budget matters, but also characterized by district members as a reduction of the new tanker truck and fund expenditures for the current fiscal year.

The one-mill reduction, to bring the tax rate down to 2.5 mills for the new fiscal period beginning July 1, would allow a return of about \$10,000, noted Donald B. Lovrin, district chairman.

Lovrin indicated that the tax reduction possibility could be the result of a grant from the state of about \$200,000, which would pay the new tanker truck. The district's budget for the current fiscal year was \$39,000, and a 4-mill tax rate initially was approved to cover budget requirements. However, the need for additional money necessitated another half-mill tax hike, bringing the total rate for the current period to 4.5 mills.

The same 4.5 tax rate based on the new grant list would realize about \$23,000 in taxes for the district, Lovrin estimated.

A report by District Tax Collector Glenn W. Linton showed tax collections to date amounted to \$109,000 out of \$113,000 to be collected. The \$100,000 represents 93.3 per cent of the taxes to be collected, Linton said.

An estimated \$10,000 or \$15,000 would be added to the district fund, bringing the grand total in this account, at the end of the year to about \$33,000, it was reported.

Discussions on expenditures for the current fiscal year centered somewhat around St. Elizabeth's Charitable Society and those funds allocated for the new tanker.

David R. Douglas, deputy chief for Co. 2, said that expenditures out of the miscellaneous fund should not have been used for areas or other similar equipment when there was a need in equipment of the firemen with raincoats and hats.

Douglas said the lack of raincoats and hats was "not good and dangerous," and that if the funds were not used for raincoats, by July, the money would go back into the general fund.

Lovrin said one of the reasons the miscellaneous account had not been used for the year was that all the companies had not submitted lists of gear they wanted. He also noted that there was a danger of overspending if the gear had been ordered without the lists.

In respect to the tanker, formerly on oil truck and bought for \$4,900 from Ellsworth and Laseau, Manchester, the commissioners voted to station the new tanker at Co. 2 firehouse.

Recommending the stationing of the tanker with Co. 2 was Fire Chief Leslie A. Kittle, who also advised "stationing the ambulance with Co. 3 Chief Kittle said Co. 2 didn't go along with the idea of having the tanker housed with Co. 2, and that Co. 1 feels they are more centrally located and should have the tanker."

Cost of putting the tanker in shape was set at \$1,600. The additional work to be done includes a new pump, radio, paint job lights and siren and other miscellaneous equipment. Not enough funds are available in the current budget to get the truck into shape, Lovrin said.

Among other possible inclusions in the next budget, are radio for installation in cars used by the chief, assistant chief and deputy chief; a base station to relay radio messages without using the present system of relaying calls to the base station in Collinsville; a new brush truck, and air conditioning in the public safety building.

The latter items will be checked with District Council members. Discussion also was made at the district meeting of the receipt of the state audit on district expenditures.
