

Plot on De Gaulle Foiled Secret Army Pushes Scorched Earth Plan

...had been arrested. A police spokesman said the six men were part of a secret army commando unit ordered to "kill De Gaulle at all costs before the July 13 (independence) referendum in Algeria."

Those arrested included Georges Bourgeois, 28, a veteran secret army commander who went under the name Lieutenant Colin. He was picked up in Nancy. Police said security agents were alerted on the trail of the "notorious" secret army supporter who was formerly a member of the National Assembly. Police said they were still searching for an industrialist from eastern France suspected of masterminding the plot.

Nineteen other secret army suspects were reported rounded up in east-central France Wednesday, but authorities said they were not linked to the assassination plot. De Gaulle insisted on starting out on his tour as scheduled Thursday, officials said.

The stern and stubborn old president has continuously brushed off suggestions he take greater security precautions.

During his last stopping tour, through south-central France last month, authorities announced the smashing of another secret army plot to kill him.

De Gaulle narrowly missed death last September when a fire bomb seized his car as he drove from Paris to his weekend retreat.

"Thousands of settlers besieged airline offices in Algiers Thursday for passage to France. One airplane was unable to take off because of a few days' delay. Authorities were unable to cope with the swelling tide of refugees."

Stamps in the News By LOUIS MANDELL

Commemorative Documentary stamp is a 10c denomination used on bonds, deeds, debentures and other legal documents. Stamps cannot be used for mailing purposes.

The new stamp is a stamp engraving of the Internal Revenue Building in Washington, D. C. Completed in 1959, this building was the first in what is now known as the Federal Triangle between Constitution and Pennsylvania Aves.

Buildings for the departments of Justice, Labor and the Post Office were later put up along side of the building program authorized by Congress in 1926.

Today, the Internal Revenue Building houses 3,500 men and women who are at the nerve center of our nation's self-assessment tax system.

The commemorative stamp is 0.8 by 1.4 inches, arranged horizontally, and printed on Gloripress in blue and white. It was designed by S. McCloskey and Victor Chiriac, Chief Designer of the Bureau of Printing and Engraving.

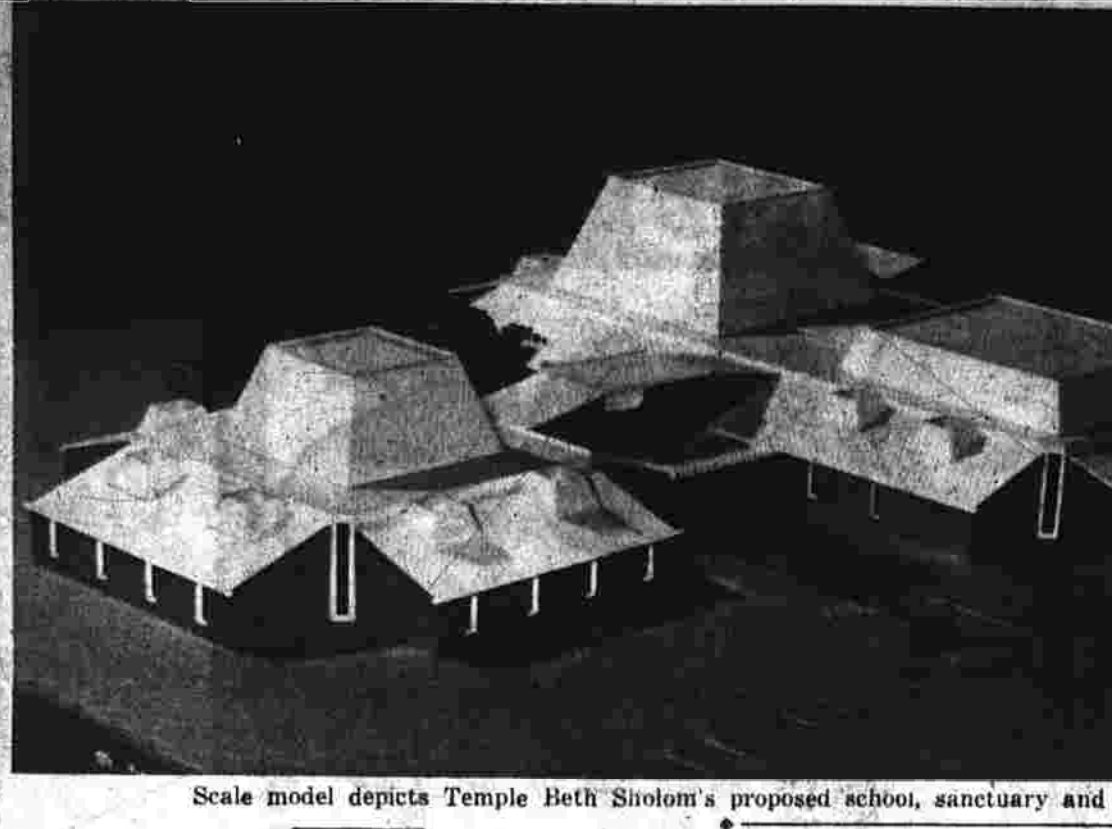

Both the pilots and engineers unions belong to the AFL-CIO, but that organization has achieved a solution by its hands at engineering, proposed by the Joseph P. Kamp with the pilots into one plane operation organization.

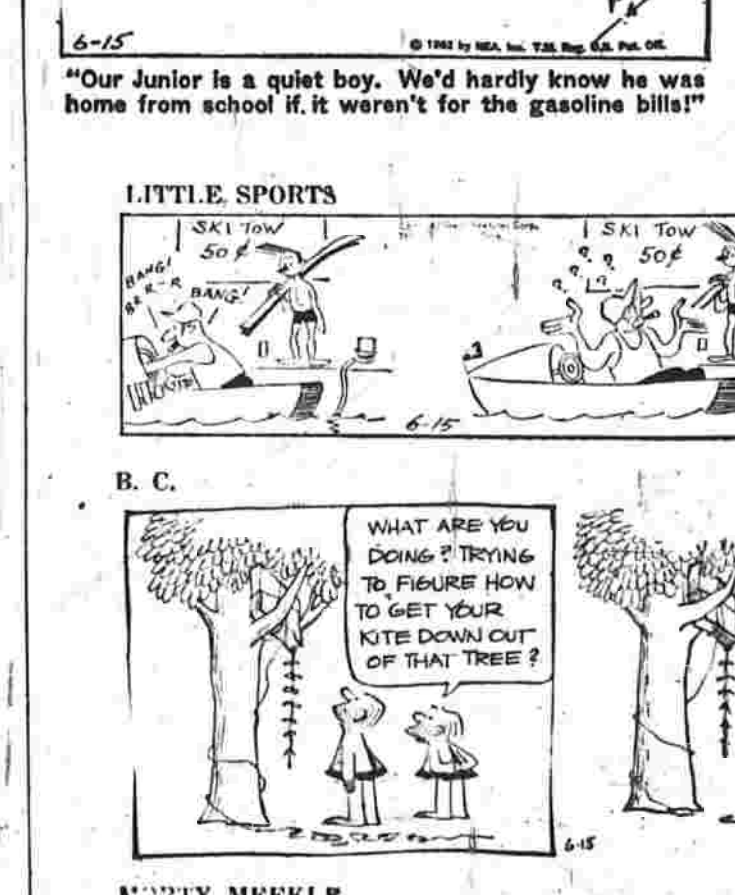

Talk Slated In Cheshire On NLRB Aim

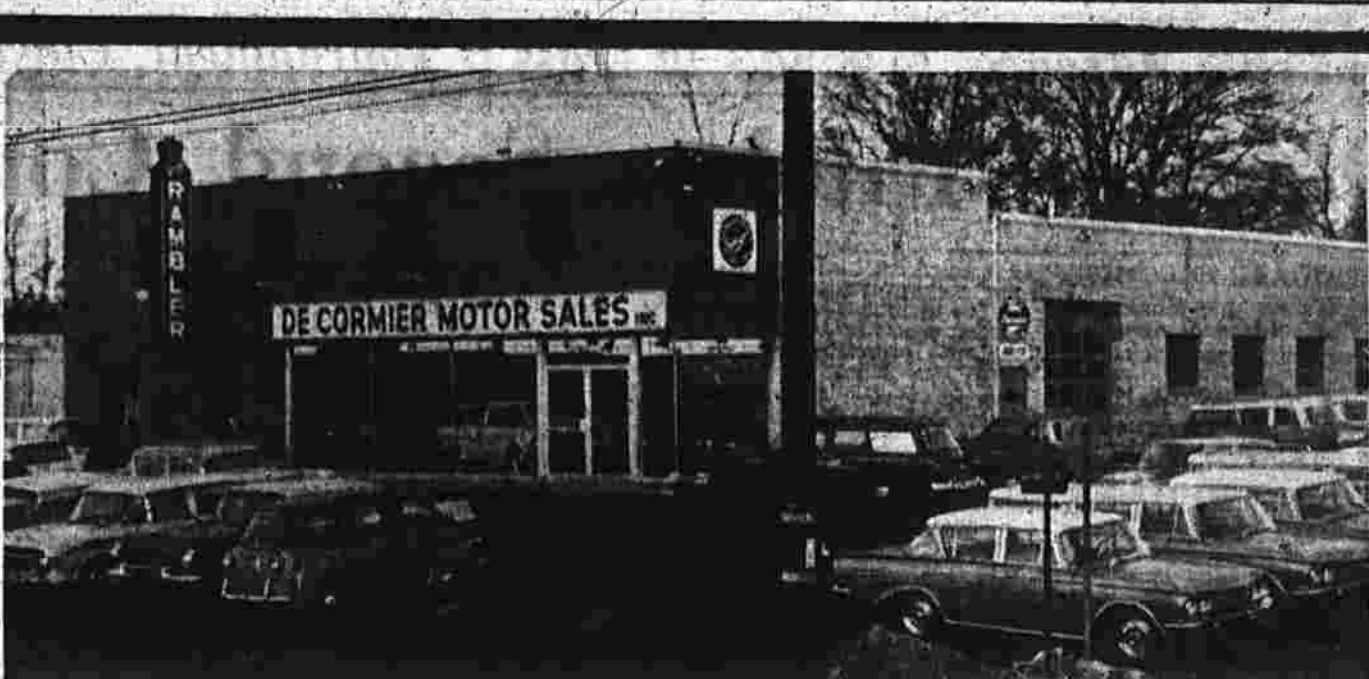
