SETBACK FOR VIET NAM SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)
Government forces have suffered a series of setbacks sharp clashes with Commun guerrillas in the north, a comm nique reported tonight. In three operations last week, the Vict Cong guerrillas killed at least 42 South Vietnamese soldiers and made off with weapons and jungles. The government also re-ported a success. A mopping up-operation in the vicinity of Ban Me Thuot, 180 miles northeast of Saigon, ended last Thursday with more than 50 Viet Cong killed or wounded.

LONDON (AP) — Swelling increased in Sir Winston Churchill's injured left leg today but doctors reported there was no general disturbance. His wife said he is much better. The swelling was disclosed during today's examination at Middlesex Hospital, where the 87-year-old former prime minister is waiting for his fractured thigh to knit. After responding favorably to surgery, the leg developed phieblits—inflammation of a vein—Saturday but doctors said this was a common complication.
