



Tass news agency said Nikolayev pronounced nee-koh-lah' yehv radioed he was feeling fine hours after completing hi first girdling of the globe in 88.5 minutes on an orbit tha carried him about 150 miles up.





During this period he covered the landing of the British troops in Kuwait, the coup by which Syria broke away from Egypt, the Syrian elections, Tanganyika's independence, the fighting in Katanga between Katanganese and UN troops, Mrs. Kennedy's tour of fadia and Pakistan, the trouble in Algiers, the Kurdish rebellion in Irag and the crisis in Laos.

Lacagnina was born in R o m e. After attending Rome University and the University of Paris, he joined the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation in Montreal as an announcer-producer for the "Voice of Canada." He was there one year, then worked for the San Francisco Chronicle as a reporter for IS months. While in the Army he was with the Army Information Service in Verona and later with Armed Forces Radio there.


