TV Notebook

NEW YORK — (NEA) — Practically everybody hopes that Andy Williams' new show will be as good as the great series he did as a summer replacement two years ago.

"It has to be better," he says. His point is simply that the summer show is remembered so fondly, and held up as such a criterion of all that is excellent in television, that the memory has outgrown the fact.

"People remember it as better than it really was," says Andy. "To equal the memory, we'll have to be much better than the original."

He thinks, as a result, that it is fortunate he was not able to reassemble the staff which produced the summer show. As a matter of fact, only one man who helped create that program will be associated with the new Andy Williams Show, which will be a Thursday night regular on NBC.

That one is Bobby Scheerer, who was a writer back in '61, but is now the director. Andy says he tried to get his original director—Norman Jewison—but Jewison had movie commitments.

With a new staff, except for Scheerer, Williams feels he has a chance to be different and better than the summer show.

"We'll frequently feature a group called The Christie Singers," Andy says. "There are 10 of them—eight boys and two girls—and they all sing and play guitars. I feel the next basic trend in pop music is country music that verges on pop music—things like Ray Charles' big album, 'Modern Sounds In Country Music.' So I want to do some things in that vein."

The Andy Williams Show will also feature, from time to time, Andy's three brothers, Bob, Don and Dick, who used to be The Williams Brothers. Andy says they will be on "as often as I can lure Dick to California."

And, occasionally, Andy's lovely bride, Claudine, will make an appearance, too, for a spot of dancing and some French-flavored repartee.

Claudine, a dancer and actress, met Andy when both were working in Las Vegas. At the time, she could barely speak English and his French was (and is) poor. But somehow they understood each other and, in fact, he translated her English into English for others.

Andy says he could have had a

regular show last season, but NBC wanted to spot it opposite Have Gun, Will Travel and Gunsmoke, and he thought the competition was too tough. This year, he'll be on opposite ABC's Alcoa Premiere and CBS' Alfred Hitchcock Hour.

His only regret is that he'll have to miss seeing the Hitchcock show.

"Our show is taped," he says, "so I'll be home. But I imagine I'll be watching my own show, to see what I've done wrong."

In 1960, "The Shari Lewis Shows" won a George Foster Peabody Award and a TV-Radio Mirror Award as best children's program of the year.
