Court Orders College Admit Honor Student

NEW YORK, Sept. 20 (AP)—A graduate of a high school honors program turned down by the city's tuition-free Brooklyn College, because his average was 7 per cent below the required 85, has been ordered admitted to the school by the State Supreme Court.

In a far-reaching decision that could have nationwide repercussions, Justice Louis B. Heller ruled yesterday that college authorities had made an "arbitrary, capricious and unreasonable" decision in the case of Melvin Lesser, 17.

Hearing Melvin from the free college, Heller suggested, would be in the nature of penalizing him for electing an honors program in high school and would encourage students to take easy courses instead.

In this program, the boy finished three years of high school in one and a half years, graduating last January, and then applied for admission to Brooklyn college.

But when Melvin's high school average was computed, it stood at 83.3 per cent, just 1.7 per cent below the average required by all the 4-year colleges of the city university system.
