Dr. Albert R. Hibbs

Children and scientists have Children and scientists have a great deal in common—particularily curiosity, says Dr. Albert R. Hibbs, nationally-known scientist and host of "Exploring," children's educational series to be broadcast on NBC-TV in color Saturdays (12:30-1:30 p.m. NYT) beginning Oct, 13.

"That's one thing I've noticed in working with children; they have exactly the same curiosity that scientists have, only with children it's a natural childsh

children it's a natural childish trait, whereas it's the business of scientists," he said. "Of course, the chief difference is that scientists are more disciplined. They will stick to a project when the going is tough. The child usually

going is tough. The child usually will drop it."

Dr. Hibbs is senior staff scientist at the California Institute of Technology Jet Propulsion Laboratory. In the spring of 1961 he taught a science class for fourth, fifth and sixth grade pupils at Sequoyah School in Pasadena, and during the past five wars he has Sequoyah School in Passadena, and during the past five years he has been a guest teacher in elementary and junior high schools in Los Angeles, Santa Ana and Passadena. These latter classes have covered mathematics, general science, the moon and planets, the US U.S. space effort and guided mis-siles. Since 1957 Dr. Hibbs has been consultant to the Los An-geles City Schools. Los Angeles County Board of Education; De-partment of Education, State of California; San Bernardino County Board of Education, and Orange County Board of Education. He has been a member of the board of Trustees of Pacific Oaks College and Pre-Primary School since 1960. He is the au-

ther of "Science in Elementary School," an article published in "Teacher's College Record." "The grade school child often can teach the teacher, more than can teach the teacher, more than the other way around—a situation that can be used to advantage," Dr. Hibbs said. "Children have surprising insight not only into relations between people, as every parent knows, but also into quite abstract concepts. The teacher expects a certain answer but sometimes gets a different one. The different one may be right but it doesn't fit—it doesn't make the point the teacher is trying to the point the teacher is trying to make. The difficult thing is to explain this to the child without

discouraging him.
"For example, the teacher presses an empty glass, mouth down, into water and asks the class what it sees. The answer the teacher is looking for is that the water does not rise in the glass. water does not rise in the glass. This shows that air takes up space. But one child says, 'I see ripples,' another says, 'I see a little spiash, and a third child says, 'The water goes up on the sides.' All of these answers are right, and there's a lot to be learned from these ripples and the other things the children notice."



Television has not made it es sential that a candidate be handsome and have a silver tongue," says Chancellor, "In this connec-tion, I do not believe that television has changed the type of candidate the public will vote for, merely am-plified certain features of that can-

There have been many articles written which contend that, because television places such a stress on appearance, future candidates will have to be photogenic to triumph. Hagan and Chancellor feel that the authors of these articles overlook one salient fact.

"Unattractive candidates," Hagan says, "have little chance in politics in the first place. They never have had. Most politicians must start at the local level, in ward politics where they knock on doors and shake hands. Television will probably never intrude at this

"And therefore, the age-old process of weeding out will continue, just as it always has. A man must graduate from this door-knocking level to something higher before television plays any part in his career." part in his career." Chancellor agrees with this think-

ing. "In our lifetime," he says, "I feet that most men major political office in this country will spring from such a begin-ning. Television cannot help them there. This process has always weeded out the unattractive men in the past, and I'm sure it will continue to do so, television or

ever has before in a non-presidential election year,
"And we're doing it," Hagan says, "because the people have come to expect it. Since the coverage of the space shots and the Berlin business, people have come to look to television for news rather than to the radio."

For intensive coverage, the public seeks out the newspaper, but for the color and the bulletins, they are turning from radio to television. And television is ac-

cepting this challenge.

Hagan says that, during the last comparable election year, 1958, there was more campaign 1968, there was more campaign coverage on radio than on television. But this year, at least at NBC, the situation is reversed and television is giving more time to the campaign than radio.
