LONDON (AP)-Battling raging seas, rescuers today
plucked from the North Atlantic 49 survivors of a ditched

families, and searched for 24 others-including two children
still missing. Three bodies have been found still missing. Three bodies have been found.
A massive air-sea mercy fleet converged on the crash scene A00 masses west of Ireland.
The British Air Ministry said five of the six rafts carried
. by the Fyisin Tiger airliners carrying 76 passengerss and
crewmen had been accounted for. Radio reports that more crewmen had been accounted for. Radio reports that more
survivors were sighted clinging to another raft were being
investigated. One rescue ship radioed she had sighted a raft but as dark-
eess fell no further word was received and hope faded.

The four-engine Super Constellation took off from McGuire
Airport, N. J., Sunday bound for Germany and ditched at $10: 12$ p.m. after the pilot radioed three of the engines failed
one after another as he struggled to reach a landing in Ireland.
The Swiss ship Celerina radioed that she had picked up the
49 survivors. The survivors-some injured and all of them suffering
from shock-were transferred from the Celerina to the
Canadian aircraft carrier Bonaventure by heliconter.
