





As Storms Smash Official Claims Intimidation in Strike at Plant Rushed Ashore in Copters

BARCELONA, Spain (AP)* Officials here compared the disaster to one near Zamora in 1959, when a dam burst and washed out an entire village with a loss of more than 200 lives.

The floods struck a few hours after the windup of a Barcelona religious festival, named Nuestra Senora de la Merced—Our Lady of Mercy—which runs for a week each fall. The event had included a song festival with entrants from many nations.

The spokesman said 246 bodies have been recovered and 295 persons are unaccounted for.

Fresh thunderstorms continued across the area, where several hours of heavy rain and high winds smashed many homes and other buildings.

By COLIN FROST CORK, Ireland (AP) Two British helicopters plucked 17 njured survivors of a ditched American airliner off the Swiss rescue ship Celerina today for hospitalization at a U.S. Air Force base in Britain.

The 9,041-ton freighter, still carrying 27 others it rescued after a Flying Tiger Super Constellation plunged into the white-capped Atlantic with 76 persons Sunday night, headed on to Antwerp, Belgium, its next port of call. The U.S. Army in Europe prepared to send medical and other aid to Antwerp for the group, American service men with a forced landing in the sea 500 miles west of Ireland. The Canadian aircraft carrier Bonaventure, which is bearing four other survivors, radioed that it expects to reach the Shannon River estuary about 9 a.m. Thursday. The carrier originally planned to arrive late today, but said it was running low on fuel and had to reduce speed.

Of the 76 aboard the plane, 28\$ were dead or missing and pre-sumed drowned. Twelve bodies have been recovered. The search for further survivors was called off Tuesday night.
