Whenever because of traffic conditions, the parking of vehicle on any public street or part thereof or on any designated municipally owned, leased or operated parking area or lot cannot in the opinion of the Chief of Police as the traffic authority o the Town of Manchester be adequately, safely and efficiently regulated and controlled, the Chief of Police as traffic authority may authorize the installation of parking meters and designate parking meter zones, fix the zone parking fee and the legal' parking time in such zones, and also fix the hours during which the use of parking meters shall be required, and in accordance therewith shall cause lines or markers to be placed upon the curb or payement, or both, of the street adjacent to each parkmeter in such zone designating the parking meter space for which said meter is to be used, and in accordance therewith shall cause lines or markers to be placed on the municipally owned or operated off street parking areas. Each parking meter installed shall indicate by proper legend the legal parking time established by the traffic authority and when operated t shall at all times indicate the balance of the legal parking time and at the expiration of such period shall indicate illege or overtime parking. In those designated municipal off stree parking lots, where parking meters have not been installed, the Chief of Police, as the traffic authority, may authorize parking spaces to be laid out, fix the parking fee and the legal parking time, and also fix the hours during which the use of the arking spaces may be permitted. Each owner or operator may, within five days of the time when such notice was attached to such vehicle, pay to the Traffic Division of the Manchester Police Department, who may be any officer in charge of police headviolation the sum of One-\$1.00 Dollar. The failure of such owner or operator to make such payment within said time


