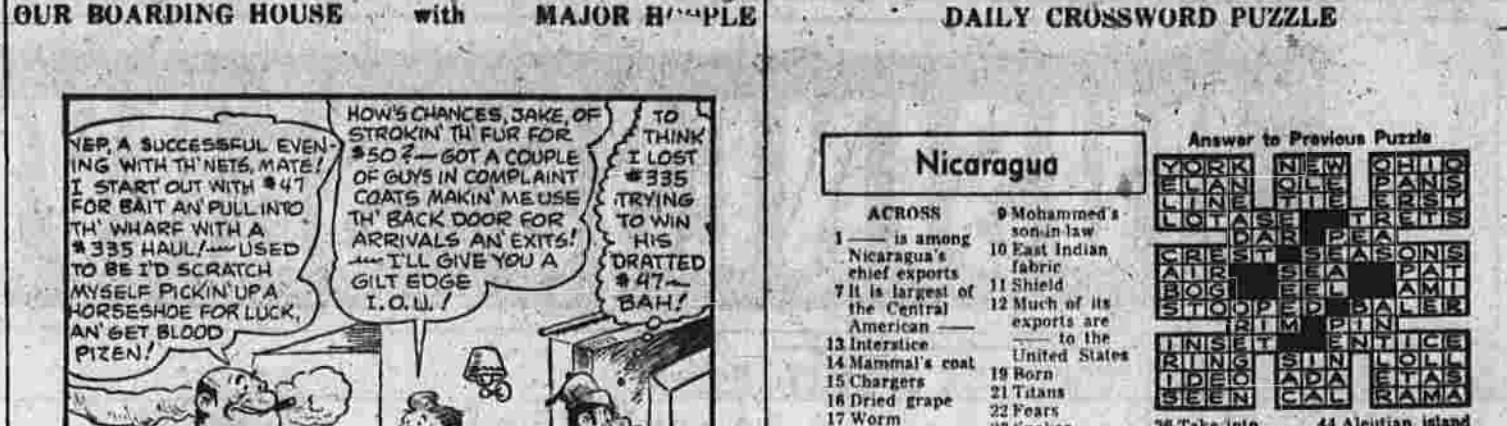

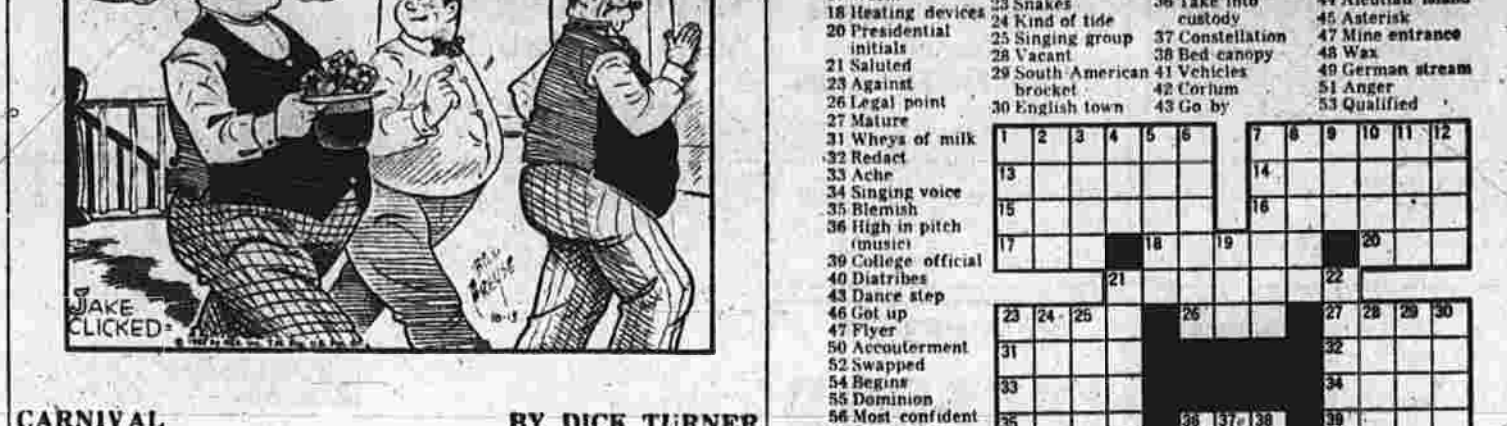

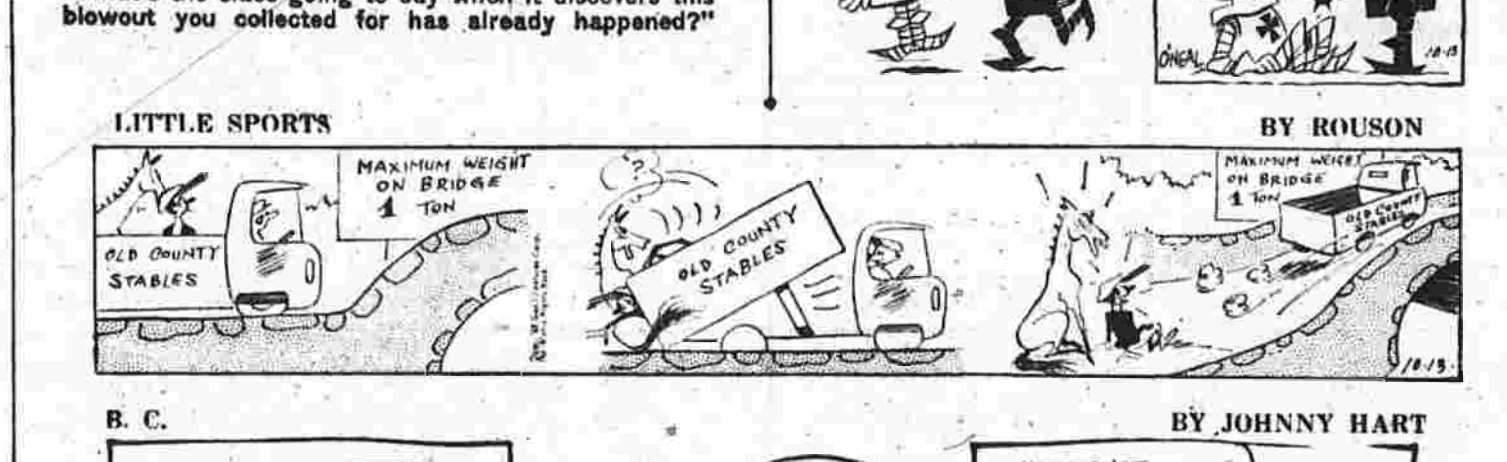

Gene Kelly Starring In 'Going My Way'

Naturally, we hesitate going out on a limb at any time. In this case, however, we feel certain that ABC-TV has a winner with its new series, "Going My Way," seen Wednesday nights 8:30-9:30 p.m.

There's no question in our mind that this series should be an odds-on favorite. Take a look at past performance. It is a popular concept in the television industry that hit motion pictures usually make good television series. "Lassie," "National Velvet," "Naked City," "Asphalt Jungle," "Father of the Bride," and "Dr. Kildare" were real thoroughbreds, and most of them made it.

This fall a new adaptation of an old favorite was entered in the TV sweepstakes. Based on the fabulously successful 1944 Paramount movie which starred Bing Crosby and Barry Fitzgerald, "Going My Way" carries the entry of the very versatile Gene Kelly as Father Chuck O'Malley and Leo G. Carroll as Father Fitzgibbon, the elderly pastor of St. Dominick's and Father O'Malley's superior.

So sure was ABC of the future success of the series that they accepted it without witnessing a workout in the guise of a pilot film. Gene Kelly's box office appeal plus the fact that "Going My Way" as a film holds the record of being not only the highest grossing motion picture ever made but also the most successful feature film ever shown on television was enough.

While Gene and Leo are better known for their motion picture work, both have appeared on television. Gene had made a few appearances during the past years in several specials while Leo is familiar to TV viewers as "Topper."

Gene hangs up his dancing shoes in favor of straight acting in this, his first television series. He admits he was not in favor of starring in a TV series and could not at all imagine himself playing the part of a priest. He felt a bit stiff in the role of Father O'Malley at first, but a chance visit of two priests to the set gave him his acting cue.

On his recent visit to New York, Gene told us about this incident. Sitting in the interview room at ABC, Gene, smiling in his inimitable way, told us, "At first I knew I was not giving the role its true expression. Fortunately, I noticed

the two priests watching the filming. Standing with their coats open, hands in pockets, I finally realized that portraying the role of a priest was as easy as portraying the boy next door. They are human like everyone else."

Continuing, Gene told us, "I was 'series minded' because of the time involved. However, when Hollywood phoned me in Paris, I knew something big was up. I was directing the film, "Gigot" with Jackie Gleason when the phone call came through. At first I was determined to reject the offer but finally decided to give it a try; and believe me, I'm not sorry. My role as Father O'Malley is a pleasant change for me. When I was a kid I was an altar boy, a choir boy and for a time I'd thought I might become a priest."

Gene said all the scripts for the series had universal appeal and espoused no particular religious cause. Entertainment was the basic aim. He also insisted that neither he or Leo would be trying to copy Bing or the late Barry Fitzgerald in the characterizations of their roles. They will have their own interpretations of Father O'Malley and Father Fitzgibbon.

Gene got his first break in show business when he drew the attention and raves of the critics for his role as a young hooper in William Saroyan's "The Time of Your Life" in 1939.

Subsequently, he served as dance director for "Best Foot Forward," staged some night club shows for Billy Rose, and drew the title role for the Broadway musical "Pal Joey" in 1940.

The acclaim he received for his performance as Joey won him a contract in Hollywood where, in 1941, he appeared in his first movie, "For Me and My Gal," with Judy Garland.

In the ensuing years he gained stature in Hollywood while appearing in other films, including

"As Thousands Cheer," "Cover Girl" and "Ziegfeld Follies."

In 1945, he starred in and directed the dancing for "Anchors Aweigh" with Frank Sinatra and Kathryn Grayson, a role for which he won an "Oscar" nomination for the Best Actor of the Year.

Gene reached a memorable milestone in his career when he starred in and did the choreography for "An American in Paris," which earned the Best Picture "Oscar" in 1951 from the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences. At the same time the Academy presented him with a special award in appreciation of his versatility as an actor, singer, director and dancer; and, specifically, for his brilliant achievements in the art of choreography on film.

That year he also won the Look Magazine Film Achievements Award, starred in and choreographed "Singin' in the Rain," which he co-directed, and starred in, choreographed and directed "Invitation to a Dance," an experimental film without dialogue in which three stories were told by means of dance. For his work in this extraordinary production, Kelly received in 1956 the Diploma of Merit at the Tenth International Edinburgh Film Festival and first prize at the sixth annual Berlin Film Festival.

In 1959 he was made a Chevalier of the Legion of Honor by the French government as a result of his original ballet which had its world premiere at the Paris Opera. Upon presenting him with the honor, A. M. Julien, director of the Opera, declared, "Until tonight, the Paris Opera was ten years behind the times in ballet. Now we are ten years ahead."

If Gene Kelly's penchant for awards has any significance, his new series, "Going My Way," is our tip to watch.

TV Notebook

NEW YORK (NEA)—Bernice Massi recalls with gratitude the fact that Perry Como fired her.

There was nothing personal in the dismissal, Como was in the process of moving his show from Saturday to Wednesday nights. He had a new producer and director and wanted a new company. So he fired all the old dancers and all the old members of the Ray Charles Singers, including Bernice Massi.

"It turned out to be a fine break for me," says Miss Massi. "I was getting complacent."

Once she was over the shock of the incident, she figured it was a good time to rekindle her theatrical ambition. That decision led to her present happy state as the second female lead in Richard Rodgers' big hit, "No Strings."

Playing Comfort O'Connell, a rich, wealthy and laced heiress, Bernice sings, dances and acts. She doesn't exactly steal the show (that's impossible with Diabhan Carroll in the lead) but she shop-lifts a little.

And she has established herself as a musical comedy performer with a big future. Already, there have been feelers for her to costar in an Elvis Presley movie, of which she says: "I'm not sure I'm ready for Elvis Presley."

It was her two seasons with Ray Charles, as much as anything else, which helped her to stardom. During those seasons, she abandoned her natural lyric soprano voice.

"I decided that I didn't like the kind of parts lyric sopranos got," she says. "In 'No Strings,' for example, the part was originally written for a blonde with a turned-up nose and a Miss Rheingold face—a lyric soprano part. When I got the part, they rewrote it to fit me and made Comfort less of an ingenuite."

Miss Massi says that singing in a television chorus requires more versatility and adaptability than in a Broadway chorus. A girl must know music to get and keep a television job, because there are likely to be changes even as late as the dress rehearsal.

"On my first Como show," she says, "they wanted to see how I would photograph, so they put me on camera. Well with my years of Broadway and summer stock experience, I was selling the song. Afterwards, Ray Charles took me aside and said 'You have a nice voice, but I'd like to hear some-

body else in the chorus, too. I was selling too loud."

Bernice Massi is a Camden, N. J., girl who from the time she went to dramatic class at 6 to learn poise, has yearned for a Broadway career. The first step was the Miss America pageant, in which she was Miss New Jersey. Although she wanted to do a dramatic reading, she decided she couldn't do justice to it in the allotted three minutes, so switched to a song as her talent display. (She could have switched to a piano or organ or clarinet solo, other talents she possesses.)

As Miss New Jersey, she got an audition with Richard Rodgers and the late Oscar Hammerstein, and landed her first big part—one of the nurses in the road company of "South Pacific." Since then, she's been in several Broadway shows—as a replacement, a member of the chorus or in a flop.

Then came Como, her pink slip and, eventually, "No Strings." Rodgers originally had a dancer in mind for her part, Bernice Massi isn't, but she does fine. "I always say I'm not a dancer," she says, "but I move well."
