Automated methods for manufacturing miniaturized electronic circuits so small that a radio transmitter-receiver using them would be no larger than an ice cube, are being developed by the Hamilton Standard division of United Air-

eraft Corporation. Under a \$240,000 study contract awarded by the U.S. Air Force's Aeronautical Systems Division, Hamilton Standard will develop automatic processes for the interconnecting and packaging phases of producing functional electronic sole that can be used with any blocks.

These functional blocks are solid integrated circuits that perform specific electrical functions. When logically grouped and interconnected, they would make up the major components of computer, communications and other electronic equipment.
