Verbal or Silent?
South Windsor Parents Challenge Prayer Rule

The board of education's policy on public school prayers came under fire at a board meeting Tuesday evening. Approximately 20 parents voiced objection to the policy, which reads: "Daily opening exercises above the second grade shall include at least one minute of silent prayer, each in his own way, and the salute to the flag; and may include the singing of a patriotic song."

The main objection seemed to be against a "silent" prayer. A verbal prayer would be more meaningful, and would be more educational for the children. It was suggested that they would be more aware of other religions. The board of education has been studying the matter since the school year in the elementary school. It was felt that the board should be given a project rather than regularly assigned basis. The board was told to Grade 6 homework is assigned four days a week for about a half hour a night. There are regular assignments in Grades 7 and 8 in two areas: Regular subject areas (mathematics, science, English and social studies); and long-term projects are assigned, such as book reports and projects.

It was suggested that the possibility of seniors in high school interested in nursing, becoming nurses' aides be investigated. Mrs. Victor B. Woodmansee was asked to revise the plan for pupil distribution to reduce the number of children in some classes. In Union School, for example, there are two Grade 2 classes with 20 or less pupils, while in Grade 2 in Pleasant Valley school, there are two rooms with 36 pupils each. An in-service course in reading for teachers of Grades 3 to 6 has been initiated with Dr. Deasy as the instructor. This course is for new teachers and teachers new to the system.

Next February it is expected a two semester course in teaching modern mathematics will be initiated under the auspices of Williams State College. UNICEF at Avery School Grades 7 and 8 at Avery Street Elementary School will "trick-or-treat" for UNICEF Halloween evening. When the students return to the school to hand in their contributions, a record book will be held for one hour. This is the first time that a UNICEF canvas has been conducted in the Avery St. area, and that is being held for the seventh and eighth grades as they were the only group in the schools with no planned activity for the evening.

U. Thant said he had further arms shipments to Cuba during the freeze.

A reply to a new note from Khrushchev was said in official quarters to be less urgent. The Soviet premier's message to the British philosopher Bertrand Russell declared Wednesday that he considered a summit meeting with Kennedy in order to do everything possible to remove the danger of nuclear war.

But in a letter to Kennedy about the same time, officials here said Khrushchev made no direct bid for a conference and Kennedy's remarks on Monday night in ordering a quarantine of Cuba.

The quarantine policy of blocking and offensive arms shipments to Cuba became effective at 10 o'clock Washington time Wednesday morning. At that hour a total of 23 Communist ships were reported steaming toward Cuba on an inevitable confrontation with the U. S. warships on blockade station unless some intervening action was taken.

That action came late Wednesday. The Defense Department announced that some Soviet bloc vessels "appeared to have altered course." Officials said that other vessels understood to be those distant from Cuba were still steaming ahead.

Sen. George Smathers, D-Fla., one of the congressional leaders attending White House briefing Wednesday, said Wednesday night the Soviet ships that veered away from the blockade were "not to turn back. He told the Miami Herald in a telephone interview from Washington, "It is my understanding that they are sonar rendezvousing perhaps waiting for instructions."

The Miami News said Wednesday it had learned reliably that Soviet ships en route to Cuba had turned back.

The Washington Post quoted reliable government sources as saying six Soviet ships headed Cuba had altered their course but did not turn back. It quoted the official as saying a Polish ship farther back was continuing to Cuba.

The story added, "It also appeared that Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev wanted satellite ships, rather than a Russian vessel, to test the U. S. defense system and search ships heading for Cuba, and thus avoid an actual confrontation with U. S. Russian forces."

Other developments related to the crisis: Washington officials reported that half of the Latin-American nations had offered to help in carrying out the blockade.

The Federal Aviation Agency directed that to civilian planes may fly over the southern half of Florida, the U. S. area nearest Cuba, unless they are operating on approved flight patterns and in direct radio contact with air traffic control centers.

The stock market surged upward Wednesday to wipe out losses suffered in the Cuban crisis. Mobilization plans for the front were brought up to date for use in the event of a shooting war.

Remove the bowl of eggs from warm water and beat with mixer at moderate speed. Add sugar gradually until mixture stands in stiff peaks. Add about one-half cup of the sugar and egg mixture to the almond paste, blend and return to the egg mixture and blend together. Fold in dry ingredients one quarter at a time. Cool melted butter and fold into batter lightly and quickly. Place in buttered nine by nine inch baking pan. Place in preheated 350 degree oven for 30 to 35 minutes or until cake shrinks from side of pan.

Frost with standard butter icing or dust with powdered sugar. For Christmas decorate top with marzipan points.

Cranberry Almond Sauce
 4 dozen blanched almonds
 4 cups fresh cranberries
 1/2 cup sugar
 1 cup orange marmalade
 Juice of 2 lemons

Split almonds and soak in cold water in refrigerator for several hours. Wash and stem cranberries. Bring sugar and water to boil and add berries and cook from 3 to 5 minutes until cranberries burst. Remove from fire and add marmalade and lemon juice. Cool and add almonds.
