MAHRC 10 Years Old, Open House Sunday

The Manchester Association for the Help of Retarded Children will celebrate its 10th anniversary Sunday. There will be an open house from 10 a. m. to 5 p. m. at the Bunces Center on Ocklet St. Dr. Franklin Froese, state commissioner of health, and Bert Schmitt, deputy commissioner of the Office of Mental Retardation, will be guests of honor at the celebration.

In 1952 a small group of parents of retarded children were brought together through the efforts of a social worker. Each of the parents had been privately struggling with a problem which daily threatened to engulf him. None are so lonely as the parents of a mentally retarded child. The fear of public scorn combined with emotional trauma usually leads to partial, if not complete, withdrawal from society. The parents are desperate in their desire for help for their child but loathe to discuss the problem or even to be seen in a hospital or a day care center.

The hearing of these parents was unique and they found companionship and understanding in the fact that they were not alone. The tremendous therapeutic value of meeting others with the same problems cannot be underestimated. Many had decided to institutionalize their children but the clinics were overcrowded and entrance to State Training Schools had to be deferred to an indefinite date in the future. Others wanted to keep their child at home as long as possible and recognized the need for special training which was not available.

The outcome of the meeting was the founding of MAHRC in May of that year. John McDevine was elected as its first president. With the help of The Herald publicity was given to the organization. Its aims and activities were publicized, and for the first time the problems of parents of retarded children were discussed in print. This brought out in the open the related field of public criticism of the child and his family. The newspaper, mostly through children in

Columbia Town to Push Suit Against Bi-Products

South had to guess which opponent started with a doubleton in diamonds. It was clear that East had only the ten of diamonds, but that he could believe that East had only the queen. If East had the queen, South could make his contract by leading the jack of diamonds through West. If East had 10-7 of diamonds left, the queen would be unguarded in West's hand, and South would win by leading the jack of diamonds rather than the ten. South had started with only 3-2-0 in the suit. The later play of the clubs indicated that West had started with three diamonds rather than with only two. West pushed the jack of diamonds through West's 7-2. Whether West played high or low, South was sure to make the contract.

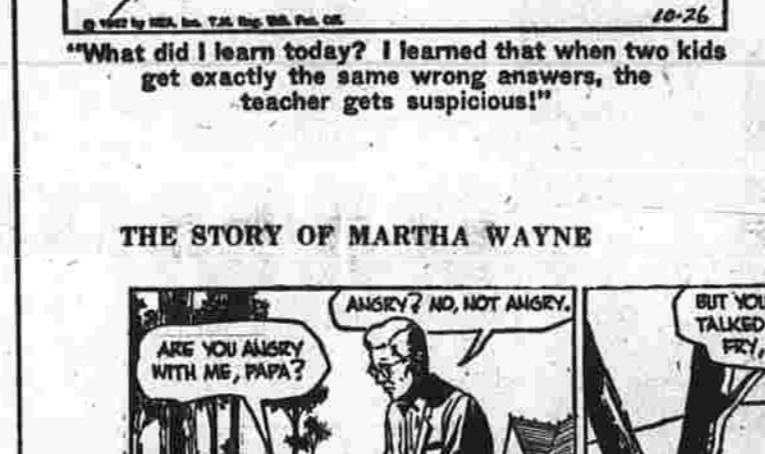
