British Nurse MMH Visitor

Nursing is more than "a functional job in a hospital that offers progressive patient care (PPC)," says a British nurse who visited Manchester Memorial Hospital yesterday through the sponsorship of the British government and the World Health Organization of the United Nations.

Miss Beatrice I. Dodwell of London said PPC—which she observed in full operation for the first time yesterday—allows a nurse to "look after the patient as a whole, not just in bits." Manchester Memorial Hospital was the first to adopt the system in its entirety.

Miss Dodwell made a brief visit here as part of a seven-week study of nursing education in the United States as a recipient of a WHO fellowship. She is principal sister tutor, comparable to director of nursing, at Manchester Royal Infirmary in Manchester, England. She said she will report on her trip to WHO and to the British

government after she returns home Nov. 10.

Miss Dodwell says she has visited schools in Washington, D. C., Boston and Hartford, and will go to New York for further studies.

Manchester Memorial Hospital is the only hospital on her itinerary with PPC, she said. The system is valuable to nurse training because it stresses the importance of both the physical and psychological sides of patients, she said.

"It has been done here with simplicity—without the use of a brand new hospital block and new equipment," she said.

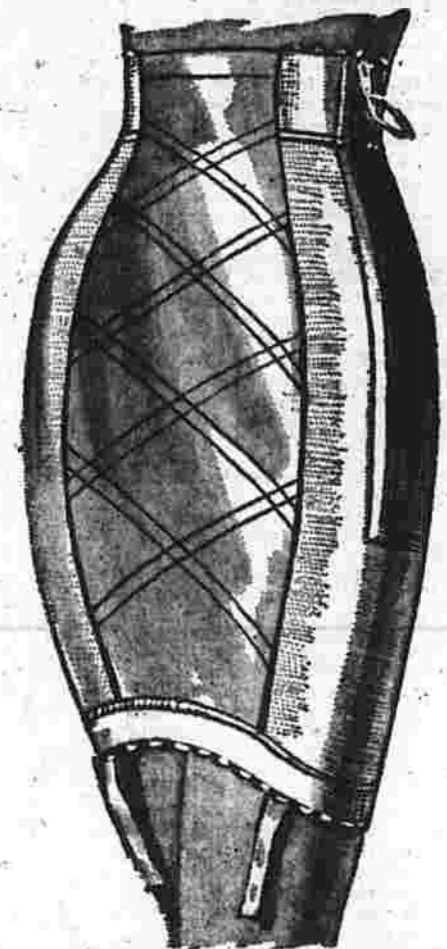

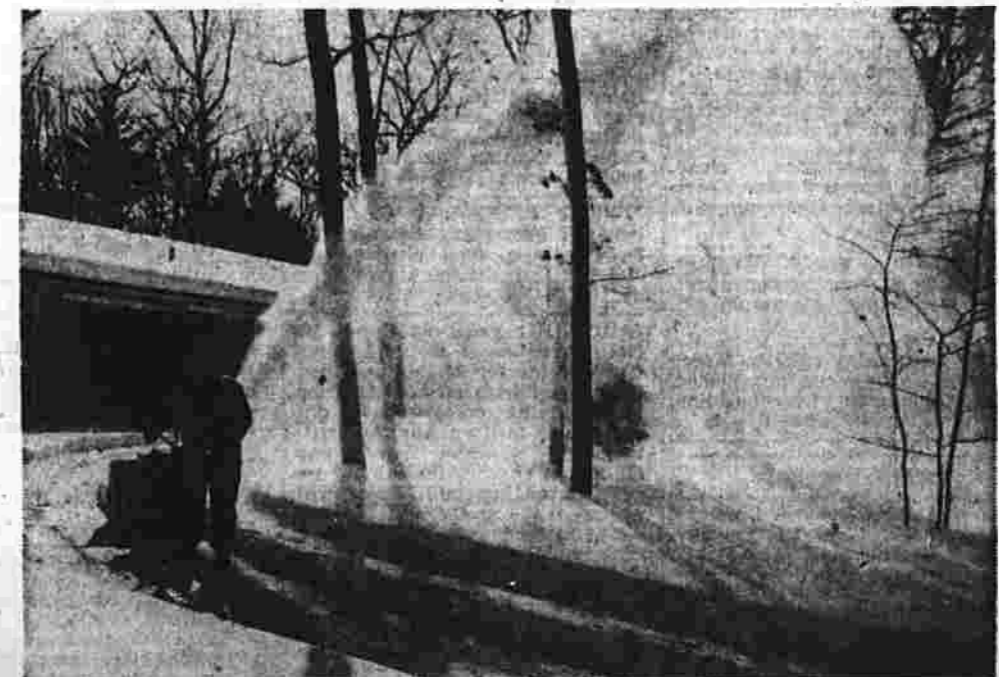

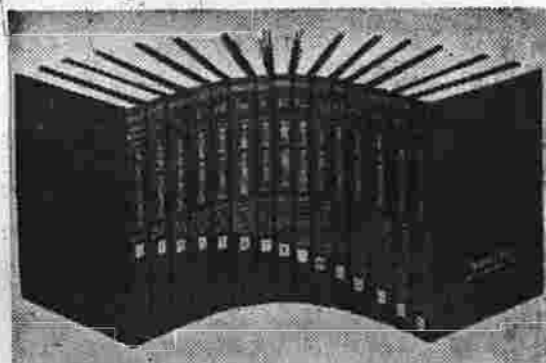
