Atty. Paul Groobert, Democrat ic candidate for state representative, said today that he agrees with Dr. Homer Babbgle Jr., newly inaugurated president of the University of Connecticut, in regard to holding the line on tuition at the university; that he would view with a jaundiced eye any such Republican proposal to raise tuition charges recently suggested by his Republican opponents.
