NEW HAVEN (AP)—Democratic Gov. John N. Dempsey was the victor today in his first race for a four-year term as Connecticut's chief executive.

The smiling Irishman from Tipperary defeated Republican John Alsop by an impressive plurality of more than 66,000 Democrat Abraham Ribicoff, former cabinet member and governor, won the U.S. Senate seat being vacated by Republi-

can Prescott Bush. He defeated six-term Congressman Horace Seely-Brown Jr. by 26,000 votes but trailed the entire Dem Democrats won all other major state offices, five of six congressional seats, five of the eight county races for sheriff

At that time, he had a plurality of 74,228 votes over his Republican opponent John Alsop. Even though the returns were not yet in from three large towns—Stamford, Norwalk and Greenwich—Dempsey was recognized the winner.

He explained that he had chosen to view the returns with his family because he was waiting for a phone call from his son, Ed, a seminarian in Rochester, N. Y., who was permitted to make one phone call to his father.

Dempsey was mobbed by well-wishers, who interrupted his progress to microphones with kisses and handshakes and declarations they had known all along he would win.

The atmosphere in the Statler-Milton hotel room was tense by contrast.

At 8:10 there was a little applause among those watchling a television set at one end of the room, when the announcer said cautiously the returns so far indicated "Ribicoff is probably going to win this election; too."
