Adenauer Arriving For Talks on Berlin

...the end of his leadership. It is easy to think that the tough American stand on Cuba would discourage the Russians from making threats on Berlin. But this reasoning overlooks a couple of points which may be extremely important to Khrushchev.

Sooner or later, some action from him can be expected. The real question seems to be whether it comes this year or later. In Stalin in 1948 tried to blockade Berlin but was frustrated by the American airlift and finally, abandoned the attempt. Khrushchev would hardly attempt a similar blockade without making it stick. Otherwise, he'd look ridiculous. But making it stick would mean shooting down Allied planes flying over Berlin. That would lead to a phrase being overworked by military analysts — escalate into war.

Khrushchev has already shown, in his Cuban withdrawal, that he is not apt to dash into war for the fun of it. He might try a land blockade, since the West insists on access routes to Berlin. That might mean shooting. West. Kennedy is not anxious for conflict, either. In the end he may offer Khrushchev some proposition that will save face on both sides, still keep West Berlin out of Communist hands, and still avoid shooting.

It will be neat if it can be arranged. Adenauer undoubtedly feels that such an arrangement is desirable.

The mood baffling part of the talks between Kennedy and Adenauer is that even if the West should offer some mild compromise it can't be sure Khrushchev would accept it.

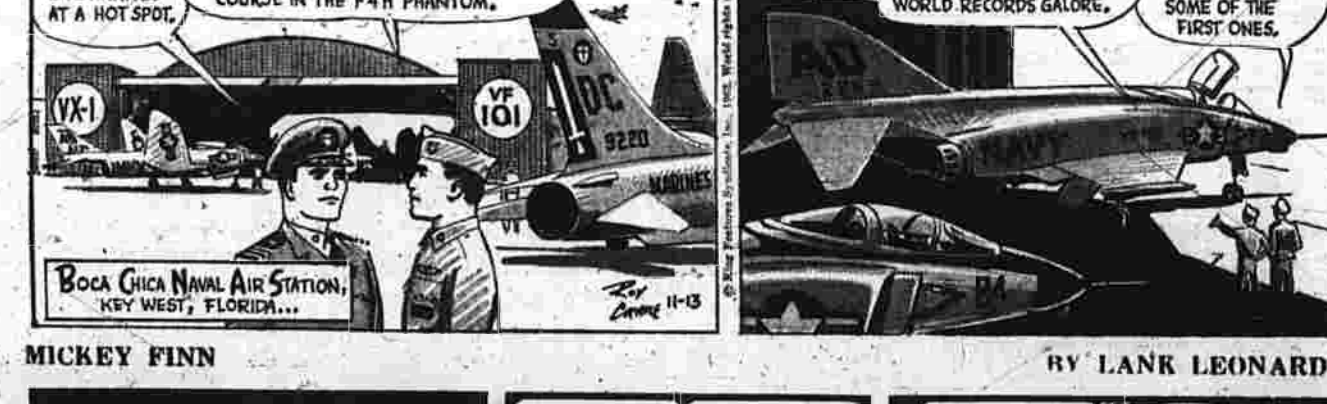

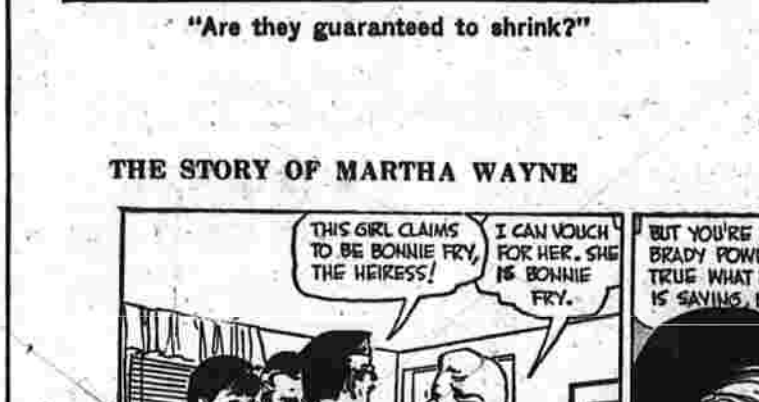
