### Hollywood on TV

HOLLYWOOD (NEA)—In story (the Owen Wister classic) and in movies (five including one which brought stardom to Gary Cooper) and in song, ever since 1902, "The Virginian" was a strong silent man of the West.

But in James Drury, the Virginian of the electronic age, television turned up the Sphinx of them all. Author Wister's story made familious the line, "When you may that pardner, smile."

Even when you amile, pardner, James Drury won't talk.

What he refuses to talk about is the business of no one, as Drury figures, but the new television series put him in the spotlight as fair game for nosy fan magazine editors.

It's the code of eastern editors that no western actor can shroud a marriage in mystery.

According to those who smoop and tell in the Hollywood jungle, James Drury has a wife named Cristall Orton, one-time actress and mother of his two sone from whom he's separated.

What James Drury mys is absolutely nothing except "nope." He won't tell anybody anything. Since I've never worried about notches on my desk, I'll leave his marital status out of this and reveal that the problems of straightening out the television show is more important to all concerned.

When "The Virginian" was announced, NBC made a big thing about the show's regular cast headed by Drury, a sort of short Clint Welker even at 6-foot-1. The first 13 shows, however, are so dominated by guest stars and "special" guest stars that the regular cast has been brooding.

So has the sponsor who flashed all sorts of red lights. Now the revue series has a new producer, Roy Huggins who guided the early "Maverick" films. There will be guest stars in future shows, but not to the exclusion of Drury & Co.

How television can take "The Virginian" and wind up in trouble is a mystery. The novel was a hit and so were all the film versions. The first, in 1914, made Dustin Farzum a star and established
