The growth of the world forum has posed an acute problem for the U.N. catering staff which handles parties at the East River headquarters.

"We can't accommodate more than 750 persons in the main dining room at one time," said Frank W. Reickert, who runs the network of bars and restaurants.

"When Algeria gave a party in honor of Premier Ahmed Ben Bella in October, the attendance was so large we had to open the west terrace for the overflow."

Most countries like to entertain during the first six weeks of the session, while their foreign ministers are still in town. Reickert was served.

gripped the British capital for the second day today, raising a threat to health and making thousands late for work.

As commuter trains crawled toward the heart of the city, health authorities warned that babies and old people should be kept at home.

"The situation is potentially serious," said a spokesman for the Medical Research Council. "Smog particularly affects the very young, the very old and people with weak hearts or chests."

London's last great exposure to smog was in 1957 when 1,000 people died from chest and heart allments during a three-day slege. Ten years ago the toll from an eight-day smog was at least 4,000, and by some estimates 12,000.

The capital's great airport was still idle after some 30 hours of inactivity. Shipping was tied up on the River Thames and cars were abandoned across the whole

The moist rolling hills produce about 75 per cent of the nation's English holly. That's the variety so popular with Americans at this time of the year. Oregon grows approximately 1,500 acres of holly, Washington about 250 acres, with northern California orchards accounting for the rest of the West Coast production.

By Christmas time, some 1,200,-000 pounds of holly will have left these Oregon packing sheds. This is equivalent to 150 rail cars, although truck and air freight now are pressed into service.

An extra heavy crop, with all boughs well berried, has caused some price cutting. Holly growers complain that this doesn't make them very cheerful, with labor and boxing costs continuing going upwards.
