### No Change Planned In Trash Collection

Trash collection will continue on a once-a-month basis, instead of being started on a weekly basis, said Chester Langtry, deputy director of public works, today.

The town's collection contractor, Anthony Botticello of Sanitary Refuse Co., would have to put more men on his payroll to take care of weekly trash collection, said Langtry, which he cannot do within the amount of the present contract.

Langtry, at the request of the board of directors, asked Botticello to whether weekly collection of trash from the curb could be included within the present contract.

The present contract, for 15 months at \$180,947, calls for twice-a-week collection of garbage and refuse from the rear of homes, and once-a-month collection of rubbish from the curb.

Langtry said that Botticello has to add men to the payroll during the first week of the month, when trash collection is done, because the garbage must also be picked up.

Botticello can add the men once a month, and still operate in the black, said Langtry, but his company would be in the red if he added them all the time.

The board of directors hoped the weekly collection could be arranged, so complaints would dwindle in relation to the hours the town disposal area is open.

The hours have been tightened, to put a clamp on indiscriminate dumping, and stop the illegal setting of fires at the disposal area.

Trash collection from the curb will continue to be on the Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday in the first full week of the month when the regular usual first garbage collection is made.

### Ex-FBI Man Disrupts Hearing On Women's Strike for Peace

WASHINGTON (AP)—A former FBI agent, who resigned in 1952, disrupted a hearing today on the Un-American Activities today with a shouted demand for the organization Women Strike for Peace.

The former agent, Jack Levine, who previously worked with critics of FBI methods, was hustled from the crowded hearing room by policemen.

Levine's interruption came after a hearing on the Women Strike for Peace at Westchester County, N.Y., had given the subcommittee an oral lecture about strontium 90 and nuclear war but pleaded the Fifth Amendment in refusing to answer all questions.

Committee counsel Alfred M. Nittie said the committee had information that Mrs. Pomer was a member of the Communist party while working in New York City public schools between 1952 and 1957.

She declined to answer when asked if she was an officer of Women Strike for Peace.

As Mrs. Pomer's testimony neared its end, Levine strode down the center aisle and shouted:

"Mr. Congressman! I am a patriotic citizen and a former FBI agent. I petition you to discontinue these proceedings before you heap disgrace on the American people."

The throng of women in the room gave Levine thunderous applause.

Outside, speaking before television cameras, Levine said he was convinced the committee hearings were "a very marked attempt to smear the American peace movement."

"I don't know for a fact if there are any Communists or former Communists in the peace organizations, but I am quite convinced they have no significant control over them," he said. "If you look hard enough you might find a Communist in the Boy Scouts."

He said the hearings were "an attempt to blanket the peace movement as Communist-inspired."

"It's simply not true," he said. "I'm not of course."

At one point in the hearing Chairman Clyde Doyle, D-Calif., said that the third secretary of the Soviet Embassy here was in the hearing room. Later a man who left the hearing told photographers that he was the third secretary, Genadi Gavrilovsky.

The big caucus room in the House Office Building was jammed by a standing room audience, mainly mostly women. Two women carrying babies sat in the front row, and one of the top kept up a steady stream of questions.

Chairman Clyde Doyle, D-Calif., handed his gavel to start the hearing.

As Mrs. Pomer advanced to the stand, the entire room fell silent. Women rose to their feet. Doyle asked them to be seated and said if it were repeated he would consider it a demonstration unbecoming for and improper.

Mrs. Pomer, a naturalized citizen who was born in Austria, soon launched her speech.

"I don't know why I'm here," she told Doyle. "But I know why you're here because you don't understand the nature of this movement. It is motivated by the concern and love of mothers for their children."

"At breakfast time they see not only cereal and milk, but Strontium 90 and they fear for the health and safety of their children."

"You should be grateful for the Women Strike for Peace. Every nuclear test makes malformations, stillbirths, leukemia, cancer and the possibility of a nuclear holocaust."

Doyle began tapping his gavel and repeating plaintively "We witness," but Mrs. Pomer kept on.

Doyle at length ruled her out of order and said if she continued the interruption he would have her removed from the hearing.

"You've made your little speech," he said. "Now let's go on."

Mrs. Pomer said "I decline to cooperate with the committee. I thank God for the framers of the Constitution, including the Fifth Amendment which I now plead."

Asked if she specifically cited the action against self-determination, she said yes. As the question went on she continued to cite the Fifth.

### Season for Shopping Is Crook's Field Day

NEW YORK (AP)—This is the period of the greatest sales volume in most American stores. It also can be the heyday of the amateur and professional crook. The list of burglaries that stores must cope with just now is a long one. Shoplifting, illegal refunds, bad checks, use of stolen charge plates by customers some times are matched by theft and pilferage by insiders.

Stores have been improving their means of fighting these losses. Electronic and mechanical devices help. Professionally trained security forces in many instances are being employed. Some stores are using the services of private investigators to check up on their employees.

Devices include monitoring television circuits, photo electric eyes that sound alarms, dual camera systems to scan check writers and return claimants, new controls over documents and in some cases lie detector tests for quickly hired extra help.

Losses in the retail field from theft, fraud and internal manipulation of records have been put as high as a billion dollars a year. Shady practices by customers may bring in much higher. Retailers are hoping to cut the total this year with wider use of the electronic and other devices. Stores that have installed television circuits permitting hidden operators to watch customers say successful shoplifting has been noticeably cut. And many have increased the number of security officers, male and female, disguised as shoppers, who keep an eye on their fellows.

Bert Lang, protection manager of Lit-Bro, in Philadelphia, says that store was losing up to \$80,000 a year in fraudulent returns—that is, merchandise bought elsewhere and returned to the store for a cash refund. It cut the loss to \$20,000 in the first nine months after installing a dual lens camera that photographs persons presenting the merchandise. Most customers are honest. The few who aren't, quickly learn to shun stores that take their pictures.

The same device, made by the Radioscope Corp. of America, is used by many stores to photograph persons writing checks for payment of goods. J. J. Korycki, Inc., a discount chain, reports that since installing the cameras in its New York stores check cashing continued to increase but losses were minimized.

### Thant Set to Ask Katanga Boycott

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP)—U.N. Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjöld is expected to ask for a trade boycott to end Katanga's secession.

Robert K. A. Gardiner, U.N. child in the Congo, warned Katanga President Moise Tshombe Monday that Thant is determined to carry out his plan to force Katanga to rejoin the Congo and will call on U.N. members to bring a halt to the Congo's economic life.

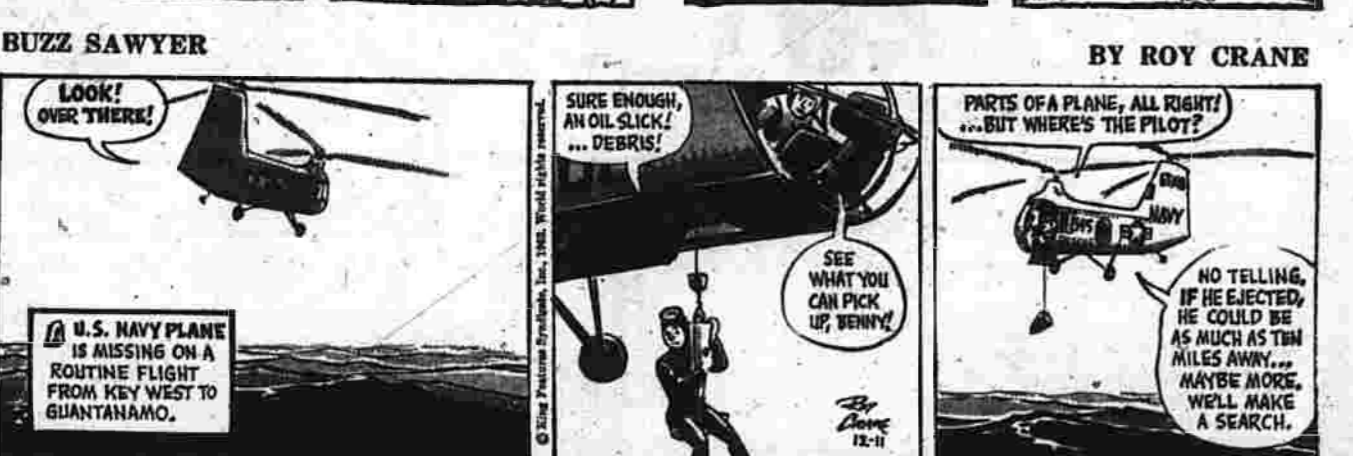
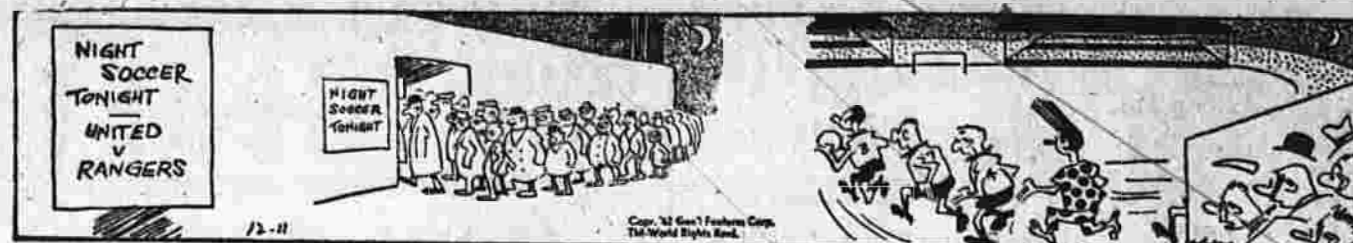
