Sokolsky Dead Spokesman for Conservatism

NEW YORK (AP)—Veteran col-mnist George E. Sokolsky, 69, ied Wednesday night in his Man-iattan apartment. A leading pokesman for American conser-vatism, his writings appeared in 299 newspapers across the coun-

Plagued by heart trouble, dia-betes and the cancer to which he had lost a kidney, Sokolsky suc-cumbed in the study of his home while making a phone call. His daughter, Mrs. Donald Feuerstein, was with him when he was strick-en. His wife, Dorothy was in an-other room. other room.

A relentless foe of domestic and international communism, thoush-haired Sokolsky drew from a world of experience in writing his six-day-a-week column and in a varied career that included stin' as a radio commentator and lecturer.

as a radio commentator and lecturer.

He had been in Russia during the early struggles for political power that culminated in communism's victory there, and he worked for many years in China. Graduating from Columbia Unversity in 1917, he went on a globetrotting tour that took his through revolution-racked Russia and restless China, where he finally settled down in 1920 to a 10-year stint as a political correspondent of the North China. Dally News in Shanghai.

There he met and married his first wife, Chinese-born, Englisheducated Rosalind Phang. She died in 1933 after bearing him a son, Eric. In the 1930s, Sokolsky wrote r column for the New York Herald Tribune. During this time, he also wrote five books: "Tinderbox of Asia," "Labor's Fight for Freedom," "We Jewa," "Labor Crisis in the United States" and "The American Way of Life." In 1940 he began writing a nationally syndicated column for the New York Sun. Shortly after that paper ceased publication in 1950, his column, "These Days," started in the New York Journal-American.

American.

His column had been distributed by Hearst's King Features Syndicate since 1944.

The columnist was chairman of the board of the American Jewis' League Against Communism, arche received numerous awards from such organizations as the American Legion, the Catholic War Veterans and the Freedoms Foundation.

The strike of printers represented by Local 6 of the International Typographical Union it already in its sixth day. Nearly 20,000 employes of the papers have been idled.

Director William E. Simkin of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service said after the talks were recessed that he would remain there subject to call.

Federal mediators said the printers and the Publishers Association of New York were simply too far apart for productive sessions.

Both publishers' Chairman Amory H. Bradford and the local union president, Bertram A. Powers, seemed to agree.
Bradford said an offer of an \$8-

a-week increase plus various fringe benefits made by the pub-lishers would cost \$14 million over the two-year term of a new con-tract if, as expected, the settle-ment reached with the printers is applied to six other craft unions the deliverers, paper handlers, stereotypers, pressmen, photoen-gravers and mailers. The union has been seeking an \$18.45 weekly increase to bring the base rate of printers to \$159.45, plus various fringe benefits.

Commented Bradford: "We want to give a contract to the typographical union, but it must be one that permits us to continue in business."

Commented Powers: "In all candor, I must say we are in a state of siege. We were unable to resolve our differences. I see little rason to be optimistic." Powers said that the union had struck only four papers and that the remaining five had shut down voluntarily. He said ITU printers

would work at the remaining five papers if they reopened. But Bradford said "This is a contract between all of the pub-lishers and the union. We told them if they decided to follow the tactic of selective strikes we would all, in self-defense, have to The printers struck the New York Times, Daily News, Journal-American and World-Telegram &
