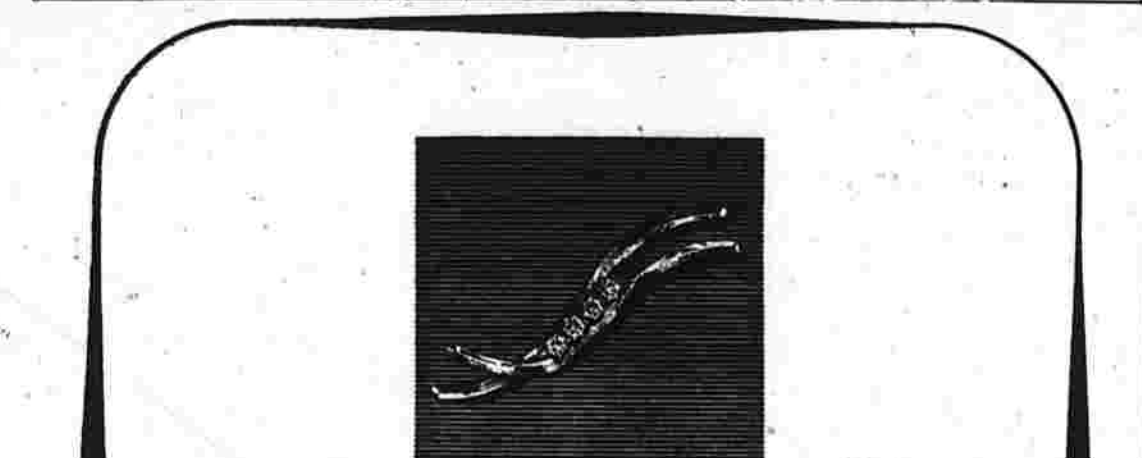

UNLIKELY CONTRACT IS BEING MADE BY ALFRED SHEINWOLD

When your side has game-winning strength, you try to knock down in a major suit of 8 or more cards if you have such a suit; otherwise you try for game in no trump. When both possibilities are barred you must choose less desirable game contracts.

South-South vulnerable

Opening lead — Ace of Diamonds

When this hand was dealt at a recent Chicago tournament, the North hand was held at one table by Professor Jay Sheinwold, of Northwestern University, one of the country's leading bridge stars when he can spare time from his mathematics.

Sheinwold rebid first to show his strength. In general, the bid sends indications to the partner that the hand belongs to them for a high part score, game, or possibly a lucky penalty.

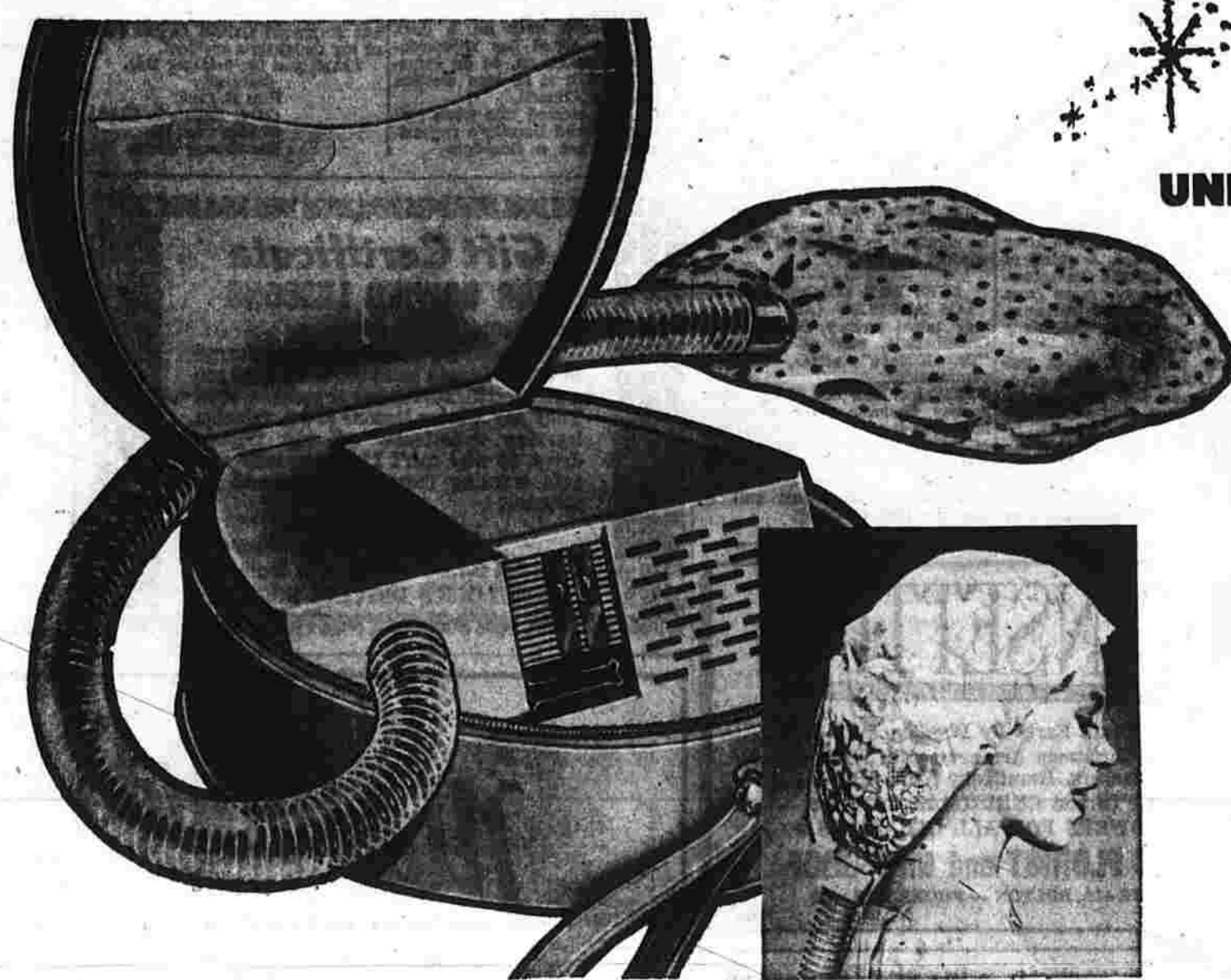

Drop Reported In Polio Cases

ATLANTA, Ga. (AP) — There were 120 cases of poliomyelitis in the United States during the first 46 weeks of this year, the corresponding period in 1961.

The Communicable Disease Center of the U.S. Department of Health Education and Welfare reported today that the incidence of polio cases in the first 46 weeks of this year. That compares with 444 cases for the corresponding period last year, 2,215 in 1960 and 1,363 in 1959.

Six cases of paralytic cases were reported for the week ending Dec. 8, compared with 11 cases the previous week. The six cases, scattered among four states, were the lowest number reported in a week since the second week in June.
