WASHINGTON (AP) — The Defense Department has set the Army's draft quota for March at 9,000 men — the biggest monthly quota since January 1962.

The higher quota, announced Tuesday, was signaled in November when the Army disclosed it would increase its strength by 20,000 men through larger draft calls for six months. The aim is to build the Army manpower to 980,000.

The quota for January and February is 4,000. In December, 5,000 were drafted.

A year ago, the Army drafted 15,000 in January as part of the buildup during the Barlin erisis.

Q—Last summer I developed
Bell's palsy. My face is drawn
to the left and I can't smile. My
doctor gave me a course of injections of vitamin B-12 and other
kinds of medicine. Is there any kind of exercise that will strength-en the muscles? A.—Facial paralysis may be due o various causes including injury, exposure to cold, infection, and numors. More often than not the cause cannot be determined. Al-though most persons with this condition recover spontaneously, electrical stimulation with a gal-vanic current helps to keep the paralyzed muscles from wasting away while nature is restoring the nerves that control them. In acute cases adrenal hormones such as cortisone may help.

Q-I have a dry mouth and lips. I have been under a doctor's care but I have not had any relief. Can I be helped?

A-Certain drugs, such as bella-donna, will cause dryness of the should be made for the cause. Remost satisfactory method of treat-ment. Ewbank's dismissal confirmed weeks of speculation that he would lose his job. He coached the Colts to NFL championships in 1958 and 1959. Since then Baltimore has been just another team in the Western Division.

Shula played four seasons for the Colts under Ewbank as defensive halfback and signal caller. Released by the Colts during the 1957 exhibition season, Shula was acquired by the Washington Redskins on waivers and played one year there. He coached at Virginia in 1959. Shula, 33, accepted a two-year contract for 1963-64 in his first head coaching position. Salary was not disclosed.

Rosenbloom said Ewbank, 55, was offered another job with the Colts. The club owner denied reports that it was the general manager's position now held by Don Kellett.

"They offered me another job in the organization, but I've had in 1958, moved onto Kentucky in 1959 and joined the Lions' staff in 1960. Shula said he would make no decisions on Baltimore coaching personnel until he talks to Ewbank's four assistants.— Charles Winner. Don McCafferty, John Sandusky and Herman Ball.


