The heart of the crisis is in France, where the lofty figure of President Charles de Gaulle repesents a key to Europe's future. Haunting fears of disaster, with which the EEC leaders have lived ever since De Gaulle dropped a bomb in their midst, seem to be moving close to reality.

The gloom over De Gaulle's concept of Europe's future has deepened so much that many diplo mats are taking quite seriously the possibility that the French president may make some overture of his own toward the Soviet

Khrushchev, hoping for heavy profits, is not likely to commit Stalin-like mistakes while the West struggles with its own home-grown crisis. He probably will be careful to avoid any Soviet action which could push the Europeans together again. 
