'Mile of the Century' Between Snell, Beatty NEW YORK (AP)—Another "Mile of the Century" is in the offing and from it should come a new world record.

"Peter Snell is coming over here some time this spring," said Jim Beatty, America's heading home to Los Angeles, "and of course we'll race.

"I don't know any more details yet, when he'll be here or where we'll run. I guess that will be taken care of later."

Snell is the New Zealander who holds the world mile record of \$:29.5, has been threatening Snell's standard ever since it was set 13 months ago in Wanganui, New Zealand. He was clocked 3.54.3 in Heisnid last year.

Beatty declined to predict the outcome, but he is on record that the mile can be run in 3:54 and he was talking about Jim Beatty. Of course, the fact that Snell and Beatty are meeting does not guarantee a fast time. There have been other busts in races matching great milers and Beatty was involved in one of them.

Only two years ago, the 28-year-old insurance agent met. Dyrol Burleson, another of America's fine milers, in the National AAU championship. This was billed as the race that might clobber the world record.

Beatty and Burleson spent almost the entire distance watching each other. Burleson finally won


