Water, Sewer Budget Study Set Tonight

The last of General Manager Robert Martin's budget hearings will be tonight at Municipal Building hearing room, where the budget requests of the sewer and water departments will be scrutinized.

Beginning next week, the general manager will start to assemble the requests from the various town departments, in preparation of a tentative budget which must be completed by March 21.

By March 28 it must be presented to the board of directors for its initial consideration.

The board will adopt the final budget sometime before May 6.

The magnitude of Martin's job may be imagined by comparing the two strands that he must weave together during the next two weeks.

On the one hand is the town's estimated income derived from property taxes, state aid, income from town funds and services departments and other sources.

On the other are budget requests from about two dozen town funds and departments, and various miscellaneous costs.

Deciding on the amount of revenue to be derived from property taxes alone requires a balance between increasing costs and a persistent plea to "hold the tax rate at its present 41 mills.

According to Joseph Murphy, town assessor, the town can demand income from the 1962 tax rate. At the present mill rate, 41, total \$8,985,043.88.

This figure includes the 2.9 mill that is collected from town residents not in the 810 District (which collects for its own protection at the rate of 12 mills).

This final figure compares with an estimated \$6,446,465 that the directors thought they could expect when they made their budget decisions last year.

To allow for non-payment problems, the directors usually slice off about one per cent of the expected tax income, however, which brings the 1963-64 figure down to about \$6,915,183.

In addition to the property tax income, there are receipts from other town and state sources to add in, as well as receipts taken in by the individual departments for their own operations.

State Will Give Diploma Exams

Application forms are now available from the State Department of Education in Hartford for those wishing to earn a high school diploma by examination. Candidates must submit their applications and a transcript of any high school work they have done no later than March 22.

The tests will be given on Friday, March 29, at the U. S. Army Reserve Training Center, 700 E. Quaker Lane, West Hartford. They are scheduled for 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. with one hour for lunch.

To qualify for the tests, applicants must be at least 19 years old, must have been out of high school at least one year, a Connecticut resident for at least six months preceding the date of application and the class with which the applicant entered high school must be graduated.

There is a \$5 fee for first applicants. The fee for retake tests is \$2. No fee is required of veterans or members of the armed forces or their auxiliaries.

In general, the fields covered by the tests include English, mathematics, natural sciences and social studies.

Haitians Seek to Topple Nixon Assaults Air Cover Lack In Bay of Pigs

Washington has shown its disfavor toward Duvalier by cutting off \$2 million in aid of Haiti's \$28-million budget yearly. The United States is helping to build a jet airport and maintain an anti-narcotics program. But the end of other aid is expected to be a harsh blow to Haiti's overdeveloped economy, based on coffee exports to Europe. Tourist business from the United States is about 20 per cent under last year's.

Haiti is perhaps the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. Most of its 4.8 million inhabitants live in hunger on peasant farms.

All Haitian opposition leaders have been driven into exile. Chief among them are veterans politicians Louis Desele and Daniel Fignole. Duvalier defeated Desele in the 1957 election.

"I believe the stiffening of the U.S. attitude toward Duvalier will bring about his downfall," Desele recently said in Santo Domingo. "If something is not done quickly I fear an invasion from Cuba."

Discontent in the army could lead to an eventual clash that could topple Duvalier.

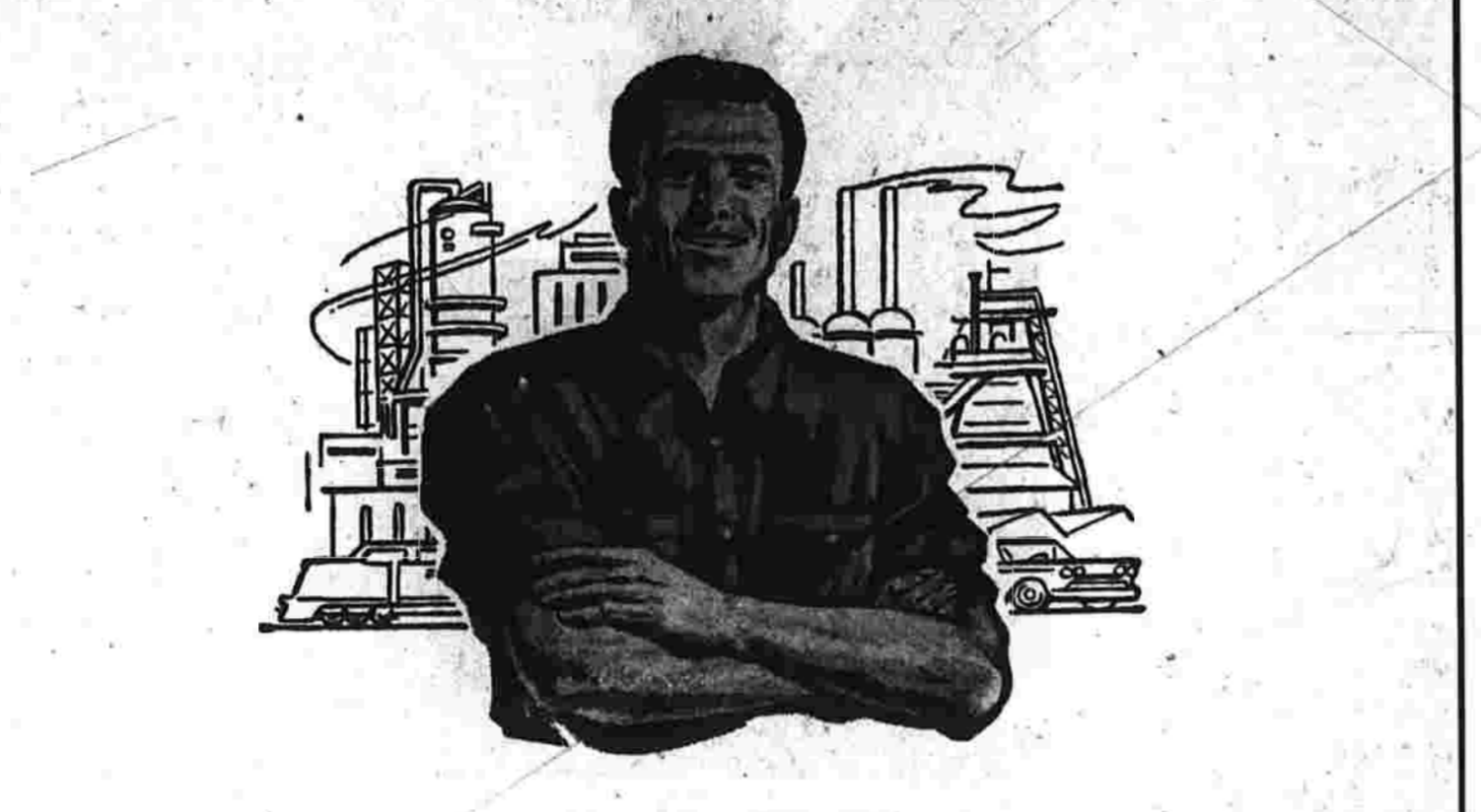
Diplomats here share the fear that Communist take-over, perhaps within a year or two, would mean a force emerges from the underground in the underdeveloped country.

Duvalier once showed a leftist tinge. But people willing to talk to a foreigner in fear-gripped Haiti say he now is bereft of ideology or thought of raising the standards of his hungry people. They say he practices a sort of political mysticism, with voodoo legends, trapping of a spiritual strength man best on sleeping power.

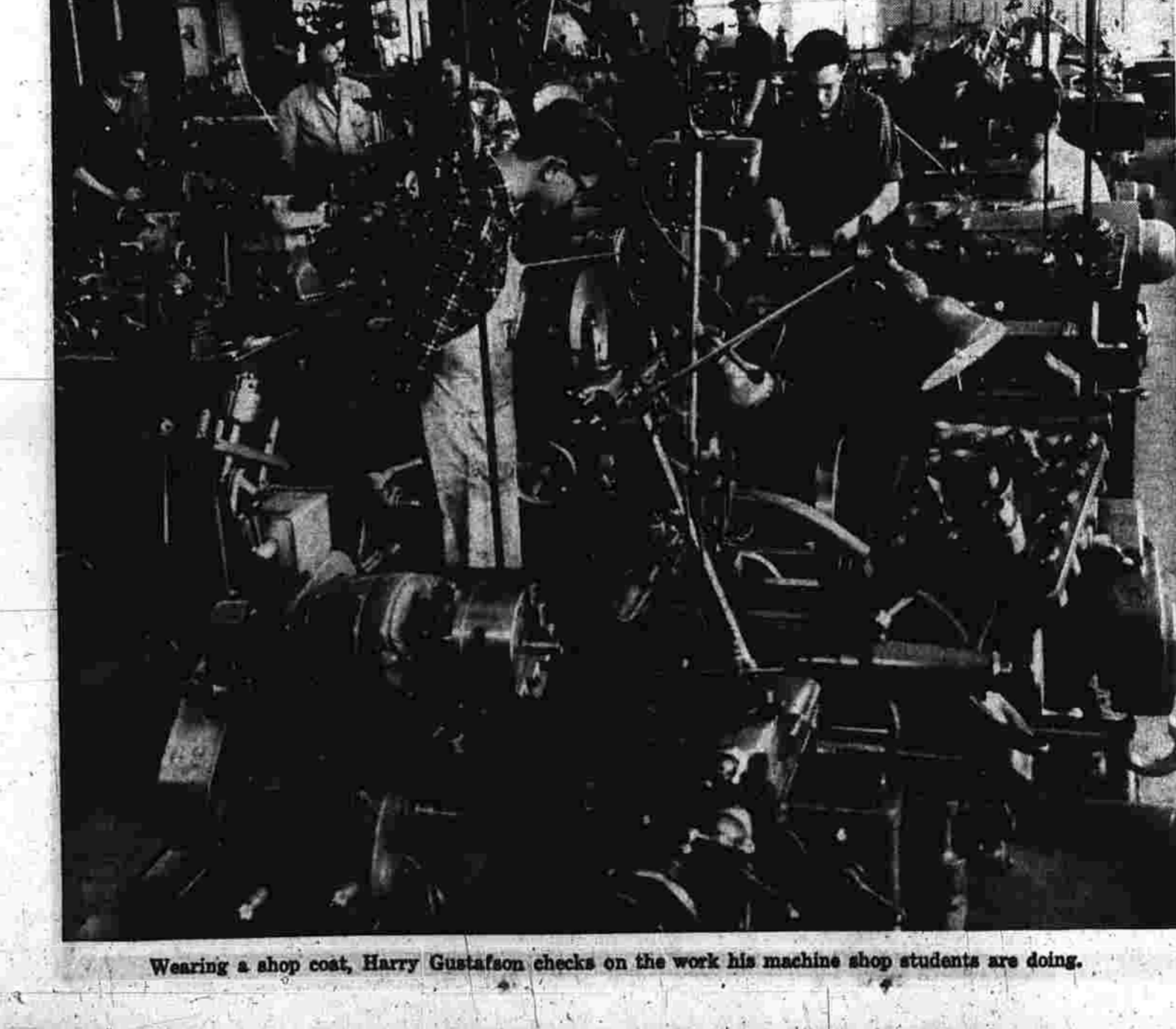
Tech School Dedication Slated

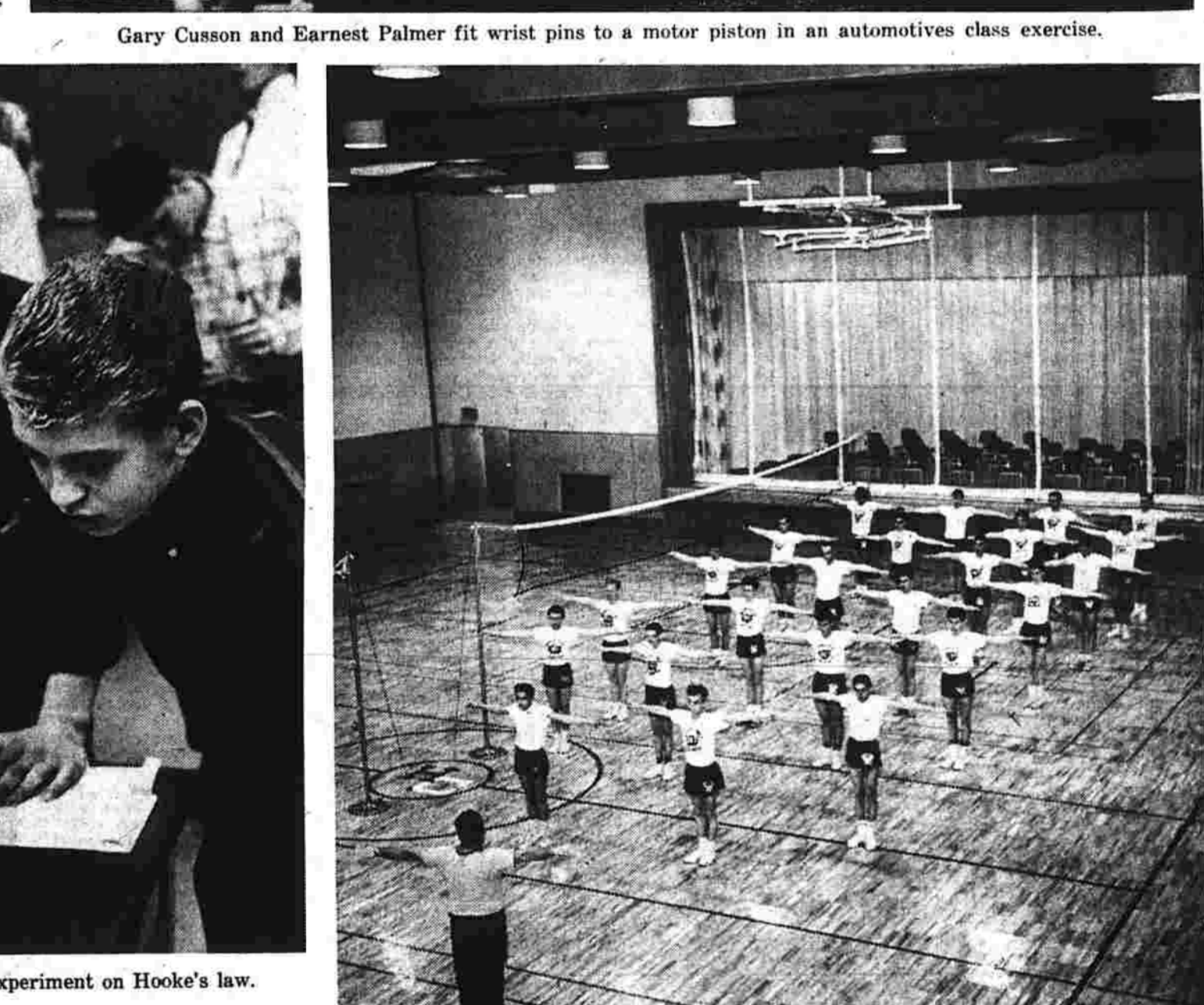

Howell Cheney Regional Technical School, which prepares its students both in the classroom and in shops for future employment as industrial craftsmen, will be formally dedicated Sunday.

U.S. Sen. Thomas J. Dodd, D-Conn., will be the main speaker at the ceremonies, scheduled for 2:30 p.m. in the school's auditorium-gymnasium.

The public is invited to the dedication and to an open house visit of the facilities afterwards.

Besides Sen. Dodd, three other state officials will speak: Dr. William J. Sanders, state commissioner of education; Dr. Joseph T. Nerden, director of the vocational division of the State Department of Education; and William Horowitz, chairman of the State Board of Education.

Dr. Fred D. Mangranelli, director of the school, and Matthew M. Moriarty, a member of its citizens' consulting committee, will also be speakers.

The Round Table Singers of Manchester High School will perform. An invocation and benediction will be delivered.

The \$2.2 million school, which replaces the 39-year-old trade school building on School St., was opened last June. On June 20, 26 students of the Class of 1962 became the first graduating class at the new site.

This year, about 215 students are enrolled in any of the five courses of study — automotive, carpentry, electrical, mechanical drafting, and machines. In addition, they study regular high school subjects. The staff of 14 is as follows:

Robert Arendt and Charles Beckwith, electrical; Maurice Clarke and Harry Gustafson, machine shop; Anthony D'Angona, physical education; driver education and health; Robert Donovan, English.

Also, Mario Fava and Gordon Shaw, carpentry; John Lagross, science; John Kleis, mechanical drafting; William McGrohan, mathematics; Robert Rimas, automotive; Wesley Thoms, social studies; and Leonard Johnson, blueprint reading and student counselor.

Johnson is also director of the adult evening school, offered on Mondays and Wednesdays to adults in the area interested in many of the same courses offered the students.

Next fall, tool die and industrial electronics courses will be added to the day curriculum with the addition of four teachers.

The contemporary structure was designed by architects Urbahn, Brayton and Burrows of New York City, and built by the Green Manor Construction Co. of Manchester. It is located on a 25-acre site at Hilliard St. and W. Middle Tpke., adjacent to the site of the also new East Catholic High School.

Ground was broken on the project Nov. 18, 1960. Although the school opened several months earlier than scheduled — in June, rather than September 1962 — work was delayed several times by strikes.

The construction was affected by a 44-day laborers' strike which ended June 8, 1961, and two other less serious strikes, one involving bricklayers, plumbers, steamfitters, plasterers and cement finishers, and the other halting glassmen.

Asked about his own political future, Nixon reiterated essentially what he said after losing to California Gov. Edmund G. Brown: "I do not plan to be a candidate for public office."

On the telecast, Nixon had this to say about GOP chances in the next presidential election: "If the Republicans are going to win in 1964, they've got to learn to enjoy fighting the Kennedy administration as much as they seem to enjoy fighting each other."

When Paul asked Nixon, "Can Kennedy be defeated in '64?" He replied, "Which Kennedy?"

Nixon repeated those assertions on the television program.

Republicans who have criticized the President about Cuba "will join in a bipartisan support for an strong action that President Kennedy will take to remove the Communist cancer," Nixon said.

He referred to the possibility of strong U.S. action in Cuba angering some neutral nations.

"The issue is not whether we've got to run American foreign policy from the standpoint of the United States of America and the defense of freedom throughout the world, and we shouldn't take a vote of popularity of the neutrals and let our policy be only what the weak and timid will approve," he said.

Nixon, in Chicago on Thursday, held his first news conference since immediately after his November defeat in California's gubernatorial election.

Nixon told the newsmen he plans a number of speaking appearances next fall and said he will support and campaign enthusiastically for the Republican candidate, whoever he may be.

Nixon A. Rockefeller, Sen. Barry Goldwater of Arizona, Pennsylvania Gov. William W. Scranton, and Michigan Gov. George Romney.

"In my view one of the four will be nominated. Rockefeller is the front runner today—the polls show that."

Asked about his own political future, Nixon reiterated essentially what he said after losing to California Gov. Edmund G. Brown: "I do not plan to be a candidate for public office."

On the telecast, Nixon had this to say about GOP chances in the next presidential election: "If the Republicans are going to win in 1964, they've got to learn to enjoy fighting the Kennedy administration as much as they seem to enjoy fighting each other."

When Paul asked Nixon, "Can Kennedy be defeated in '64?" He replied, "Which Kennedy?"

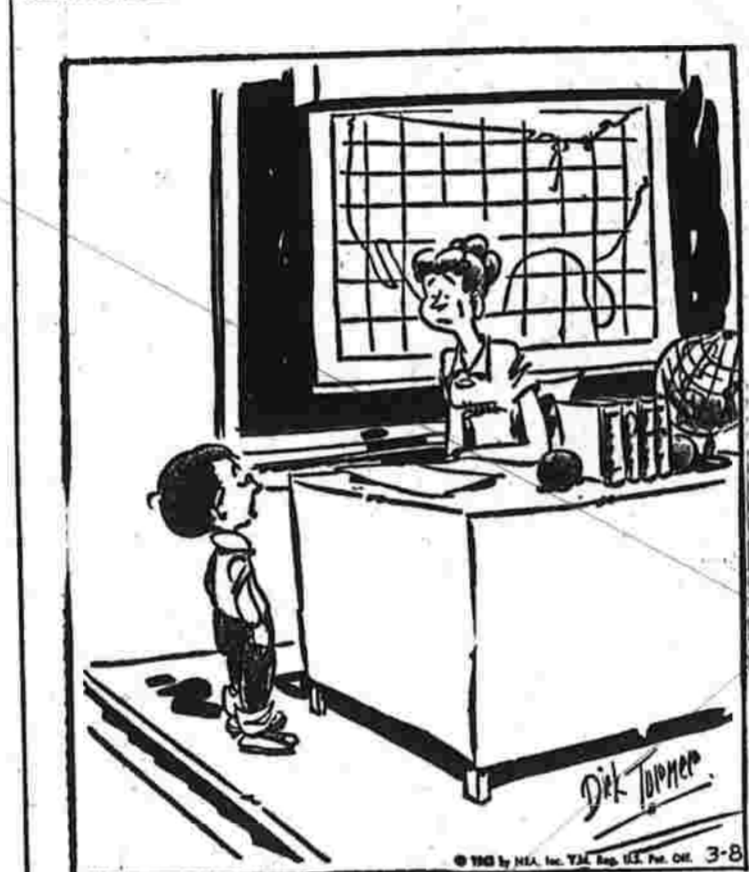

(Continued from Page One) Syria's wounds are deep and old. Once a proud nation, dominating a vast area. But she has a history of instability, a colonialism, of big power politics. Halfred years in the Arab world, which the Arabs consider an expression of western imperialism. Syria's history is one of investigations by the Egyptians, the Assyrians, the Macedonians, the Persians, the Mongols, and finally the Turks of the Ottoman Empire, who ruled the country harshly for 400 years. After World War I the French came to the Levant with a League of Nations mandate. At the end of World War II, the French could hold out no longer and Syria won her independence in 1946.
