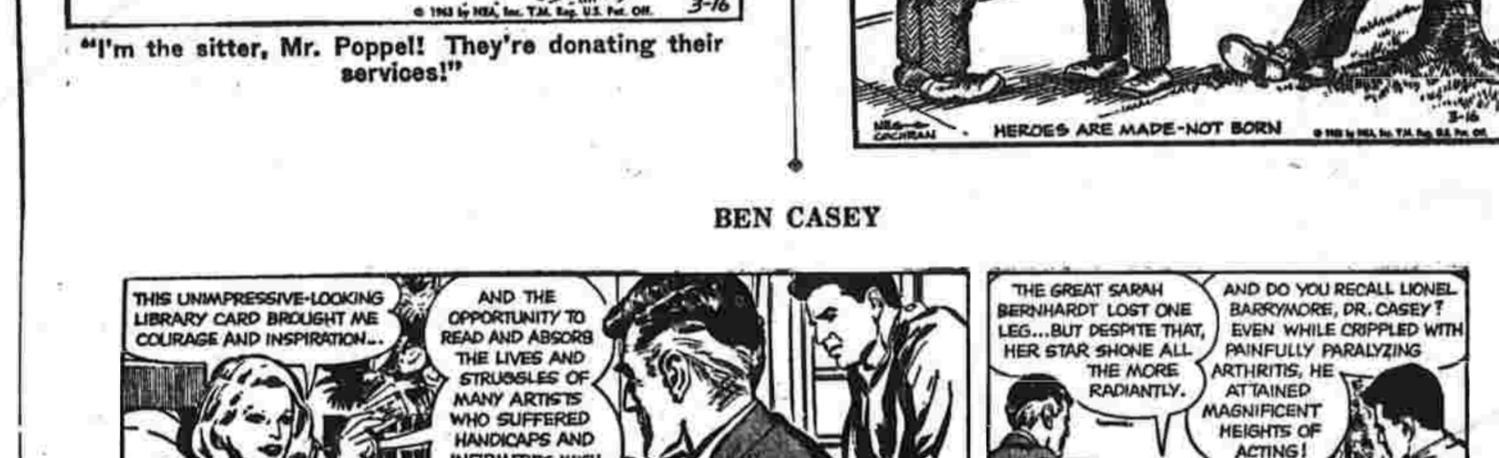
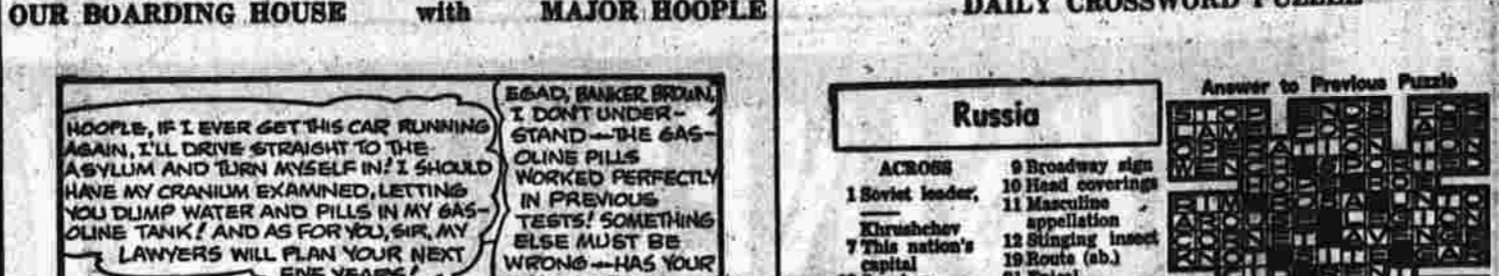

Garry Moore Called Pleasant Perfectionist

Garry Moore has cleaned up what had become dirty words to a lot of back-tagers... words like "showman," "starmaker," "comedian." Because he's all three and there isn't a single tantrum on his record. As a matter of fact he's disinclined to hire anybody who is inclined to tantrums either on his guest list or his staff.

The crew-cut showman is now well into his fifth season of the big-league Tuesday night "Garry Moore Show" on CBS-TV (10-11 p.m.) and the eleventh season of his Monday panel program, "I've Got a Secret."

This is the third version of a "Garry Moore Show" the first being on radio and the second, a daytime TV-er which ran eight years (from 1950 to 1958) and which Moore dropped in favor of the big Tuesday night opus.

For some reason, not now clear, it was generally assumed that this relaxed, genial "personality" wouldn't succeed with the night time audience.

Somebody must have forgotten that he'd barely cut his wisdom teeth when he co-authored a play with the late F. Scott Fitzgerald and that for five years he was partner in comedy to Jimmy "Schnozzola" Durante!

A little actress who's recently signed for a Broadway show moaned, "It's very grim, we have

only six weeks of rehearsal before we open out of town."

Luckily, Garry Moore and his gang don't look at things that way—for they have to put on the equivalent of a Broadway show every week... and more people will see that one TV show than would see a Broadway show in a year.

And just to make the challenge, a little more so, and to add a little zest, the whole caboodle took off on a coast-to-coast jaunt, originating two shows from Hollywood and a third (to be seen March 19) from Lake Tahoe with erstwhile regular, comedienne Carol Burnett—a Moore protegee—back for her fourth guest shot of the season.

Things are hectic enough when they're on familiar ground in the New York theatre that's home base. Rehearsals start Monday in separate rooms where dancers limber up and learn their numbers by choreographer Ernie Platt, singers sing; comedians run through their scenes; costumes are fitted and friendly chaos reigns.

Then all of a sudden it's Friday. All the separate acts are put together on stage for the first time during a morning run-through. Gary himself is all over the theater, onstage when he's in a scene, now huddling with writers on re-write, now going over a bit of business with Ernie Platt, now surrounded by the Chorus kids or bantering with one of the regular guests like Dorothy Collins. It is like a family, and a happy one at that!

Then, as I saw him once do, he might rush to settle himself in a front row seat, puff at his cigarette and be audience... laughing fit to kill at a skit Nancy Walker and Durward Kirby were working up.

By evening, with not a frazzled nerve in the gang, the forty-piece orchestra, 21 member dancing-singing group, guest singers and guest comedians are ready for two audiences... the dress rehearsal and—following hard on its heels—the actual taping.

Hailed now as the greatest comic talent to come along in this generation, Carol Burnett consistently throws bouquets at Gary. He helped her shoot to stardom just as fast as she could go. Now after three years she's gone off on her own—with best wishes from Gary—and a million dollar contract with CBS.

It's a rare thing when a performer is willing to share a spotlight... Gary's even rarer; he gives promising talent the whole spotlight.

With Carol away from the show except for a few guest visits each season, you'll be seeing more and more of Dorothy Loudon who has a singing voice that's both smoky and cheerful and a fleeting facial resemblance to both Carol Burnett and Nancy Walker. She's finding good reason to whoop it up because Garry tuned her in on an Ed Sullivan Show

TV Personalities

Gene Rayburn

Genial Gene Rayburn, veteran host and panelist of almost a dozen shows, is convinced that his new daytime series on NBC-TV, "The Match Game," is destined for a long and popular run on television—and for one vital reason.

"For the first time," Rayburn says, "the audience at home can participate in the quiz game to the same extent as the contestants on-camera. Why, the panelists just represent the viewers by proxy!"

Two teams, each consisting of a celebrity guest and two audience contestants, compete on "The Match Game" (Mondays through Fridays, 4-4:25 p.m. EST). The teams score points by matching answers to questions fired by emcee Rayburn.

"This show is loaded with fun, too—the format seems to inspire humor in our contestants," Rayburn adds. "Once I asked the teams to name a canal. Most contestants replied 'Panama' or 'Suez'—but one gentleman answered, 'Guadal-Canal.' The audience burst into laughter."

Rayburn himself has a lot to do with the surprises and humor that mark "The Match Game." Gene has a spontaneous and inventive talent for comedy that first asserted itself in the late 1940's when he teamed with Jack Lescault and later Dee Finck on highly popular shows over New York radio stations.

In addition to his current "Match Game" TV assignment Rayburn is one of the hosts of "Monitor 63" on the NBC Radio Network, handling the Saturday (3-6 p.m. EST) segment each week.

Gene was born in Christopher, Ill., but grew up in Chicago where his family moved when he was still a baby. He attended grammar school in Lindbloom High School there before entering Knox College in Galesburg, Ill. He left college after his freshman year to go to New York, where he was hired as a page by NBC.

Between guide tours, he attended the network's announcing school, where out-of-town station managers hired young men aspiring to careers in radio. He landed his first announcing job with WGNV in Newburgh, N. Y. After a year and a half he moved to WTTB, Baltimore, and later to WFIL, Philadelphia, returning to New York in 1942 to work at WNEW. He stayed there until enlisting in the Air Force, where he became a bombardier-navigator in B17s.

After the war, Gene returned

to WNEW and a morning radio program. He then teamed with Jack Lescault on a show called "Jack and Gene," which became an important springboard to his career. When Lescault went to another station, Gene teamed with Dee Finck. This partnership of "Rayburn and Finck" resulted in a two-man program of comedy patter which was highly successful. This partnership continued for more than five years, until 1952, when Gene joined NBC, where he has worked ever since.

First, WNBC gave him his own radio program, and two years later he joined Steve Allen on the latter's local television show. He continued with Allen on the NBC-TV Network's "Tonight" and then on the Sunday evening "Steve Allen Show."

Gene was star and host of "Dough Re Me" on NBC-TV from February 1958 through December 1960, and has also been associated with "Play Your Hunch," "To Tell the Truth," "Choose Up Sides," "The Name's the Same," "Head of the Class," and other game shows.

Demonstrating great versatility as a performer, Gene has also appeared in TV dramatic roles on "Robert Montgomery Presents," "Kraft Theatre" and other series. He was host of the "Miss Universe" TV special in 1962.

Gene has also done extensive summer stock work, including appearances in "Seven Year Itch" and "Will Success Spoil Rock Hunter?" In the summer of 1959 his performance in "Who Was That Lady I Saw You With?" broke all attendance records at the Bucks County (Pa.) Playhouse. Gene took the starring role in "Come Blow Your Horn" on Broadway in the summer of 1962, and also starred in "Bye, Bye Birdie" in 1960.

Gene is married to the former Helen Ticknor. They have a daughter, Lynn, who is studying theater scenic and lighting design at Carnegie Tech.

Gene is a private pilot and enjoys flying on weekends to relax. He is also proud of his gardening "green thumb," and enjoys golf, tennis, squash and photography.

where bad bad luck dogged her and she just wasn't coming across. The last thing she expected in those endless minutes was another TV booking, much less a call from Garry Moore telling her he felt she had talent and would she like to be on his show? Would she!

Moore went right from high school in Baltimore to a radio station where he worked as a continuity writer. On the side he kept himself occupied with an amateur theatrical group, then one night the station put him on the air without warning. A featured comedian was sick and substitute Garry Moore clicked immediately.

"The most soothing music in the world is the sound of laughter," he says. He moved on to radio announcer and then to writer and comedian for "Club Matinee" with Ransom Sherman from Chicago. It was on that show that he struck up a friendship with Durward Kirby that has seen them allied professionally for years now.

In 1943 Garry teamed up with Jimmy Durante for the weekly radio program that was to last five years. More big name shows followed until 1949 and the first "Garry Moore Show" on radio.

Garry came by the name, because he decided impetuously on the air one day that maybe Thomas Garrison Morfit, his real handle, was not a good fit and started a contest, which was won by a woman in Pittsburgh who dreamed up "Garry Moore."

Around the house, and off on his boating holidays, and legally, he's still Thomas Garrison Morfit. "There is no Garry Moore on weekends," he says. Around his present home town in Westchester the Morfit family is very well thought of. But newcomers sometimes do a double-take...like the fledgling delivery boy who ran pop-eyed back to his boss gasping, "You'll never guess who opened the door at Mrs. Morfit's!"

Conductor Donald Voorhes of NBC's "Bell Telephone Hour" started his conducting career at the age of 17, directing the Eddie Cantor show, "Broadway Brevities."

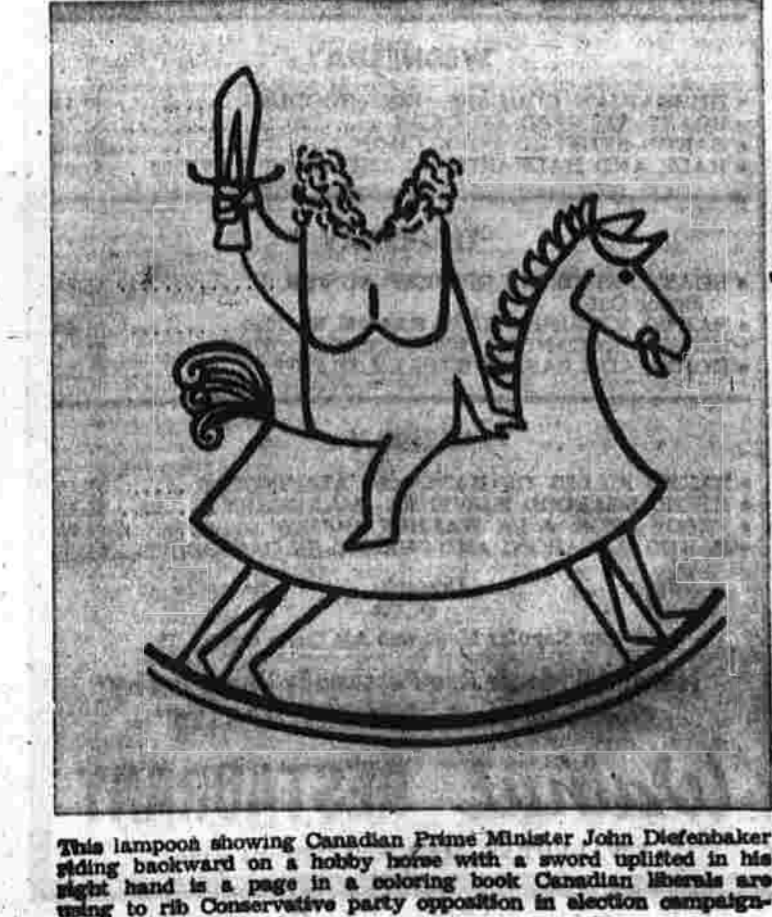
