

COUNSEL GUARANTEED WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court ruled unanimous-ly today that states must pro-vide free counsel to defend poor persons in all criminal trials. This new rule of law for state courts is much broader than any previous decision. In previous decisions the court has held that defendants in capital cases are entitled to free counsel. It also has required counsel in some other cases such as those involving ignorance and illiteracy of the defendants, their youth, and circumstances of public hostility.
