Citizens Air Dump Problems, **Direct Continuation of Study**

The citizens committee on Vermon's trash disposal problem was directed last night at a public hearing to wrestle with the problem for another 60 days, studying its rubbish, matters had reached a negrouper of an impasse on

its rubbish, matters had reached somewhat of an impasse on whether the town should buy a site now for future use.

2. Can the town find a better site in a 100-acre tract on Box Mountain offered at the last minute Monday night by a man who is saking \$400 per acre?

3. Since the town will have to provide an area for disposing of anon-combustible material, as well as for the ashes of combustile material, would it be wise to build an incinerator now, and pay for it

terial, would it be wise to build an incinerator now, and pay for it with fees collected from other towns who will one day run out of disposal area and turn to Vernon for service?

The pros and cons of these and other problems were argued last night in the probate court room, jammed to standing capacity with town officials and electors.

Frank DeTolla, a civil engineer and a member of the citizens committee on trash disposal, said that these were the criteria used by the committee to select a site:

1. The site must be no closer than 400 or 500 feet from the nearest housing area of 30 or more houses.

2. It must have a tree screen.

3. The site must be suitable for construction of an incinerator.

4. The land should be zoned for industry, and it should be accessible via a route causing the least disturbance to residential areas.

The site comprising the 15 cores owned by Werner O. Kunnil and the 15 acres owned by Raymond Clark meets these requirements, said DeTolla. The one drawbook is the plan to filter liquid waste through a leeching field, he said. The State Water Resources Commission might oppose any pollution of the river.

Beria House Haunted, Say Some Soviets

By EDDY GILMORE MOSCOW (AP)-If Moscow has a haunted house, it's the former home of Lavrenty P. Beria, chief of Joseph Stalin's secret police.

Russians and foreigners say strange things go on there at night; strange lights hover over the roof on certain occasions.

They insist it's a meeting place for black cats.

Late at night, Russians returning home on foot cross to the other side of the street.

Hundreds of Boviet citizens remember that day in June 10 years ago when a squadron of tanks rolled down Tchaikovsky Boulevard and surrounded Beria's home.

home.

Whether Beria was arrested then at home or at a meeting in the Kremlin is still uncertain. Soviet leaders have related several versions.

But the tanks were there that day in June and wild rumors followed their appearance and Berland ia's execution. The house became a kindergar ten—but not for long.

"My little boy was there for a while," said Lydia A. Smetanova, "but he became nervous and frightened. I removed him. The place was haunted."

Another mother whose child was at the school said, "She couldn't sleep when she was there and she finally begged me not to send her there anymore."

Other Russians scoff at the idea. Other Russians scoff at the idea that the house is haunted, but many admit they wouldn't like to live there, even if it meant the luxury of space and a bedroom for every member of the family. Today, Berla's old home is the Tunisian Embassy.

Friends of the Tunisian envoy say that as far as he's concerned. say that as far as he's concerned it's just another house.

"But not the wife of his predecessor," said the wife of a European ambassador. "She was frightened to death of the place. She said all sorts of strange noises kept her awake. There were moans and groans and unexplained footfalls and slamming and banging of doors."

One old Russian woman walks One old Russian woman walks past the house with head erect. She wasn't afraid of it when Beria was alive, and she's not afraid of She was moved in 1951 from house being demolished and found herself in a room across a side street from the Beria residence. "Every time I tried to walk on "Every time I tried to walk on the sidewalk, a uniformed policeman would run me away," recalls Elizaveta Kazanina. "They would say to me, 'Get off the sidewalk, boushka (grandmother), he's about to arrive'."

One day she happened to be leaving her apartment house as Beria arrived in his limousine.

She dashed across the street and shouled. "I want to talk to you." shouted: "I want to talk to you."
Beria halted, spun around and,
in amazement, asked her what
she wanted. who like a great gross bedbug has blouted himself with the blood of the Russian people. I'm sick of Beria's bodyguard roughly hur tred her away. She ended up with a three-year state behavior. Nowadays she is back in her old room, across from the Beria house with its high brick wall. Does she think the house is haunted?

Spring Hints Good Outlook For Business

By SAM DAWSON

NEW YORK (AP)—With spring at the treshold, many business men are cautiously deciding they may be better off than they were admitting.

They won't go so far as to say that business shouldn't be a lot better than it is. And they have problems and worries by the bushel. They often do.

But neither today's conditions or tomorrow's prospects are as dire as many were saying a little while ago.

as many were saying a little while ago.

Federal slide-rule artists, after a new look at the employment figures, find some improvements scattered amidst the bad news they released earlier this month. The steel industry is enjoying a mild sort of boom. Auto makers can reel off both figures and hopes—all on the rosy side. And spring could work its minor miracle among the winter weary and send auto sales still higher.

Unemployment is the most chronic pain. But even if may be eased somewhat by spring's opening up of more outdoor jobs.

Labor strife—present and potential—is a particularly large cloud this year. But whether it blows away or becomes a major thunaway or becomes a major thun-derstorm is yet to be seen. Corporate earnings reports most-ly are on the cheerful side. Indications are that the trend is continuing. Dividend payments have been rising. The stock market discounted this some time ago, and now is looking about for new prospects to foretell.

Employment figures take on a cheerier hue as the Labor Department looks the latest forester. partment looks the latest figures over and finds they weren't as bad as could be expected in the final weeks of winter. This is nown as adjusting them season

ally.
On this basis, factory jobs increased in February for the first time in seven months. While the factory work week actually dropped a bit, it wasn't as much as usual for the time of year. So, seasonally adjusted, it is recorded as lengthening after the contract. seasonally adjusted, it is recorded as lengthening after two months of shrinkage.

All of this is designed to take some of the bitter edge off the increase of the rate of unemployment to 6.1 per cent of the total labor force, the highest percentage in 15 months.

Steel production's seven straight weeks of expansion puts it 19 per cent higher than early February. Some of the gains come from stock building as a hedge against the possibility of a strike late in the summer. Some is credited to the summer. Some is credited to rebuilding of stocks allowed to dwindle during the steel industry's private little recession.

But a good part of the new orders is reported to be from customers who need the metal for use now and in the street. now and in the spring as their own business expands. Two of steel's big customers—autos and construction—have been doing fine and see no letup soon.
