Storm Kills Three On West Coast

A hit-and-run wind and rain storm chalked up three deaths and numerous power failures in north-ern California and southern Oregon Wednesday before it sped The deaths were all in the area around Crescent City near the Oregon border, but most of the power losses were along the Ore-gon Coast, chiefly in Brookings, Gold Beach and Coos Bay. Wind gusts of 74 miles an hour were clocked by the U.S. Coast Guard at Brookings. Crescent City measured 72 m.p.h. blasts. Winds

dropped to a peak of 63 m.p.n. as the storm passed through Port-Washington.
California's only reported ma-jor power loss was in Vallejo, 25 niles northeast of San Francisco. where poles blew down and service was out.

Many northern California points reported an inch or more of rain. the storm victims were:
