She would be deductible, for instance, if she served as her husband's secretary or had a role in the convention program.

The membership dues of country clubs and the costs of operating yachts or hunting lodges would be proportionately deductible if more than 50 per cent of their use is devoted to "ordinary and necessary" business.

Limitations were set on deductions for travel when the taxpayer tacks a vacation onto his business, trip, if he is away from home for more than a week and if the pleasure jaunt occupies more than 25 per cent of his total time away from home.

In such a case, he can claim a deduction only for that portion of his transportation costs and hotel bills which represent the business portion of the outing.



MMH School Gets Approval

The Manchester Memorial Hospital School of Medical Technology has been approved by the Council on Medical Education and Hospitals of the AMA and the Board of Repolls of Chinical Pathologists. of Schools of Clinical Pathologists, according to hospital spokesmen. Dr. F. P. Becker, head of the Dr. F. P. Becker, head of the pathology department, said that while the hospital has been train-ing technologists, they were not necessarily people with college background. Now that the school has been approved, academic standards have been set up.

Applicants must have at least three years of approved college education, including particular courses in basic sciences. The school, operating in con-junction with the pathology de-partment, will accept two proper-ly trained students for a 12-month

training period.

Students will receive formal instruction and practical training in the performance of many types of laboratory tests.

"Yup" shot back Ryan, who wasn't ... but by then was determined to keep busy and get ahead. (There's more of that "Cooper-coincidence here, too. At the outset of his career back in the 1920s the late star had started out alternating bit roles and stunt work. Falling off horses was his specialty.)

Ryan, outgoing but not cocky, has a kind of charm that wins instant friends; in this case, the professional stunt men. Instead of screaming "faker" they took him over and taught him sunt work on the sly, "so I wouldn't break my neck" says Ryan. And it was fast salling for him from novice to apprentice to stunt man, "falling off horses, jumping off towers and choreographing fights—the works."



the first plane-to-ground TV show. When S. S. Morro Castle burned off Asbury Park, N.J., Grauer in-terviewed the first survivor ashore. He made the first on-thespot news broadcast about Count Folke Bernadotte's assassination

Grauer, whose voice was de-scribed "the most authoritative in the world" by the National Academy of Vocal Arts, is one of the most accomplished ad-libbers in broadcasting. He once describ-ed a parade for 50 minutes without

any intermission. For 12 years (1940-52) he was commentator for the NBC Symphony Orchestra broadcasts conducted by the late Arturo Toscanini.

A quick-thinking, fast-moving broadcasting personality, Grauer has been assigned to the Lindberg kipnaping, the Hauptmann trial, the maiden flight of the dirigible Akron and Akron, and many political con-ventions. He has provided vivid word-pictures of Poughkeepsie reword-pictures of Poughkeepsie regattas, the national tennis championship, heavyweight title bouts and 20 consecutive New Year's Eves at Times Square. From United Nations headquarters in New York, he has reported the fastbreaking developments in the crises on Lebanon, Suez and Hungary.

Grauer is a trustee in the Academy of Television Arts and Sciences, and serves on its Emmy Awards Committee. He is active in the Overseas Press Club, of which he is a former vice press-

which he is a former vice presi-dent, frequently serving as mode-rator at OPC panel discussions.

rator at OPC panel discussions.

Among his most treasured honors, Gruier was decorated by the French Government with the Legion of Honor in 1956.

He was married in 1954 to Mehine Kahane, noted interior designer. The Grauers live in a dupler apartment on New York's East Side, where Ben not only ministers to his volumenous information, but operates his own "between hours" hand printing press.
