



I have had many requests for he names of doctors in various arts of the country who perform he operation on the carotid sinus for the relief of asthma. If your family doctor cannot give you the name of such a doctor, you might contact your county or tate medical society.

Q—Please tell me something about osteomyelitis. Is it due to a deficiency of calcium? Is it related to home cancer? Is there a cure?

A — Although a deficiency of calicum will cause some bone discease, it does not cause esteemyelitis which is an infection of the bone marrow. It is not related to cancer. The germ responsible for over 80 per cent of all cases is the staphylococcus or ordinary

over 80 per cent of all cases is the staphylococcus or ordinary pus germ. The antibiotics that cure most staphylococcus infections do not work well against this disease. This is because, even though a high concentration of the drug is built up in the blood, the antibiotic does not reach the infected bone in sufficient quantity to produce a cure. It may help, however, to control the infection. Rest in the hospital is usually required and after the acute stage has subsided, surgery is almost

has subsided, surgery is almos always necessary to bring abou

Q—I am a 42-year-old house-wife. Recently I began to get blackheads on my face. My skin is very oily. What do you sug-

A — Blackheads are related to some. They are due to some degree of overactivity of the oil glands of the skin. Since your skin is oily you should wash your face four or five times a day. The blackheads should not be squeezed because of the danger of infection. Even if they are evacuated under antiseptic conditions they tend to come back in the same place. A modified female sex hormone (16-epiestrol-3-allyl ether) has recently been shown to cut down

A modified female sex hormone (16-epiestrol-3-allyl ether) has recently been shown to cut down the oiliness of the skin. Insofar as it does this it may also reduce the production of blackheads.

Q-When I got sick about six weeks ago my doctor said I had walking pneumenia. Now he says that the inflammation in my lungs has all cleared up, but I have a bad cough and it's not getting any better. What should I do?

A — The term "walking pneumonia" is not commonly used but I assume that you had some congestion of the lungs without fever. A chronic cough may follow any kind of pneumonia. The commonest causes of such a cough are bronchiectasis (described in a recent column), pulmonary tuberculosis, daily exposure to smog or irritating fumes, lung cancer, and congestion of the lungs due to a leaky heart valve. For such a wide range of causes there can be no single type of treatment. Effective treatment must be based on discovery of the cause and then attempting to vernove it. A treatment that would
