Ulcerative colitis is a baffling disease. Its cause is unknown. It is easy to recognise and hard to treat. Although progress in the treatment of this disease is being made, it still takes the lives of many children and young adults. The idea that it was caused by a germ or virus was held by some authorities, but has been abandoned, chiefly because there has never been an epidemic of the disease and it rarely attacks more than one member of a famemotional element plays a part in causing or aggravating the disease. Direct observation of the mucous membrane of the colon in a victim showed that anger or resentment caused increased muscular activity of the wall of the colon, engoyement with

muscular activity of the wall of the colon, engorgement with blood, and small hemorrhages un-der the mucous lining.

Few, however, believe that this is the only factor involved. The stress and strain of the struggle in young people to be-come economically indpendent may be a factor. Recent studies strongly suggest that a food al-lergy may be an important cause.

cause. Whatever the cause, the ulcers that form in the colon and the resulting diarrhea rob the body of essential nourishment and lead to extreme loss of weight and weakness. Add to this a slow but steady bleeding from the affected area and it can be readily seen hat this is a serious disease; and, without proper treatment, it is a Fortunately, much can be done for the victims. Early in the course of the dis-

ease an attempt must always be made to control the process with-out operation. In many patients operation becomes necessary, the preliminary medical treatment puts the victim in a much better condition to withstand the opera-tion. Rest, avoidance of emotion-al upsets, and a diet without roughage are the basic require-ments. Blood transfusions may have to be given.

Medicated enemas have been tried, but have been abandoned because they further irritate an already damaged bowel. Psychoanalysis has also been found to be of little if any value in treatment of persons with ulcerative collities.

Home Gardener's Handbook

Build a Patio, Then Landscape It

U IMAGINATIVE

Written for Newspaper Enterprise Assn. A patio or terrace provides ex-FLAT BLOCKS IN PATIO BACKGROUND If you want the patio for lounging and entertaining, plan it close to the house, with easy access to kitchen or living room. If you want it for outdoor cooking and eating, locate it farther from the house, with the fireplace at the farthest side.

The simplest terrace to build is of flagstones or lightweight concrete blocks sunk in a bed of sand. Bricks are decorative: however. Bricks are decorative; however, they are more work to lay. You may want treated blocks of end-grain wood, such as redwood, old railroad ties or telephone poles cut into sections four inches deep. Soak the wood in creosote if the blocks are not already treated

against rot.
Use a carpenter's level, stakes and twine to outline the patio area. Slope the surface one or two inches in every 12 feet away from

sand. If the soil is sandy or welldrained, four inches of sand is adequate.

Many flagstone patios have
been put right on the unprepared
surface of light soil. Winter tends
to make soil heave, however,
Weeds and grass between the
stones are a nulsance, too. If you
build under a tree, raise the level
of the entire terrace slightly with
sand, rather than digging down
and cutting tree roots.

Landscaping the patio depends
on the screening you want from
busy areas, to prevent cross-traffic and the kind of flowers, shrubs
and plants you enjoy most.






