try, insurance agents, the state insurance commissioner, and the dean of the University of Con-necticut's Hartford College of In-Byrnes said the future hearing would definitely be conducted b the House committee, and he im plied that it would do so with he participation of the Sena committee.

Sen. Edward L. Marcus, chairman of the Senate insurance committee, indicated that the Senate might still try to take part in the investigation but he declined to say just what steps it would take.

He said the Democrats would first want to know just how the Republicans plan to proceed.




