Interior Ministry officials said they did not know when or how Rajakovic entered Austria. Dr. Wilhelm Harster, who Ger man newspapers have said was Rajakovic's immediate superior during the war, stepped down from his post as an adviser to the Bavarian Interior Ministry.

The Bavarian government announced Tuesday it was investigating allegations that Harster, an SS major general during the war, had a hand in the deportation of 100,000 Dutch Jews to extermination camps.

Harster, 59, asked the ministry to pension him because of ill health. He has been an official of the state government for six years. Officials said they knew of his past when they hired him.

Navy, Air Force Watching Tests on Breathing Wing

EDWARDS AIR FORCE BASE, Calif. (AF)—Both the Air Force and the Navy will be watching closely when an experimental plane with a "breathing wing" begins flight tests here late this month.

The Air Force is interested because it footed the \$30-million bill for the radical X21, designed to show how planes can fly 50 per cent farther on a given amount of their.

The Navy has a secret interest: how to apply the same principle to underwater vehicles, increasing their range and perhaps their speed.

The Navy won't admit it has an interest in the X21, but informed sources say experiments are under way with this method of reducing the turbulence that builds up around bodies moving in either air or water.

He added that a study he has made shows that most towns with children's museums underwrite an average of 60 per cent of the yearly operating expenses.

Dr. Sumner says the \$5,000 would allow Lutz Jumfor Museum to hire a custodian for \$1,420, a full-time secretary for \$2,800, and in a year an assistant director for an estimated \$4,000.

He says next year salaries will amount to \$10,000 if the new personnel are hired, bringing operating expenses to \$16,000.

Supt. of Schools William H. Curtis, an ex-officio museum trustee, said the school board's annual allocation is "a payment, not a contribution" for the services Luts provides.

Later in the evening, Town Director Ted Powell said that while he agrees that the museum should have more funds, he is "reluctant" to have the town pay as much as half of the museum budget since the museum is not a public body.






