Wadhams and May of Hartford expect to begin work on construction of the Orchard Hill school Monday. Construction cost of the 24-classroom school is \$761,000, including site work.

Orchard Hill, chosen as the name of the town's newest school, is a happy reminder of the former use of the land on which it will be located. The 24-room school, designed by Kane and Fairchild of Hartford, will be built on the southwest corner of the Pease Orchard, bought a year ago by the town for school and recreation purposes.

"I forced open a door and led these people out," he said, gesturing toward a frightened group of their women and children.

Roseann Radzanski, 13, a high school senior of Brooklyn, said, "It was dark. I was scared. Some lady fainted. A lot of the women were crying."

The conductor told everyone to get back into the second car, there might be less smoke there. But we found plenty of smoke there, too. So the conductor calmly said, "If you will walk back to the first car, I will help you out the front of the train and lead you out."

We followed him. Then the firemen arrived. They forced the side doors open and helped us out safely.

Unemployment in Manchester increased slightly to 1,097 for the week ending April 13 compared to 1,071 for the previous seven-day period moving the town from 14th to 15th ranking for total unemployment in the state.
The increase brings unemployment about 5.4 per cent higher for the week ending April 13, about 270 of the claims were filed by Rockville residents, also accorded by the Manchester office.
Of the total 1,097 claims, about 39.1 per cent, or 426 claims, were initiated by women.
Manchester jumped one place higher on the rank list of towns as Norwich claims dropped 62 per cent, to a total of 1,030. Norwich had ranked 13th and Manchester 4th for many weeks.
Part of the increase in Manchester is attributed by the State Employment Security Division of the Labor Dept. to a layoff of about 40 employes by a transportation equipment firm in the Manchester area.
In the state as a whole, unemployment increased to 38,134 from 37,840 the preceding week.

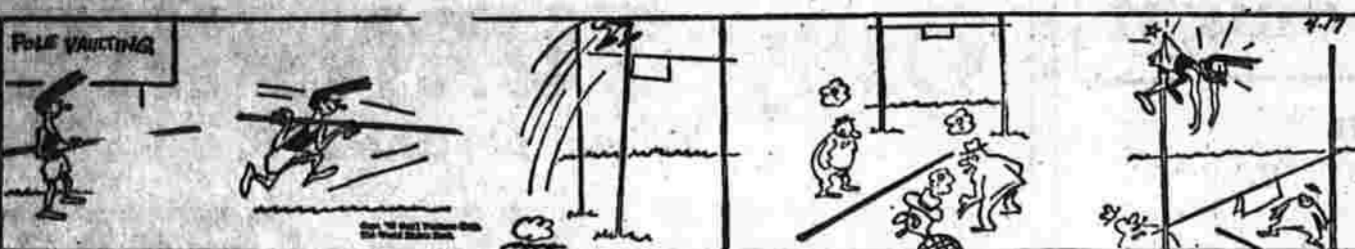

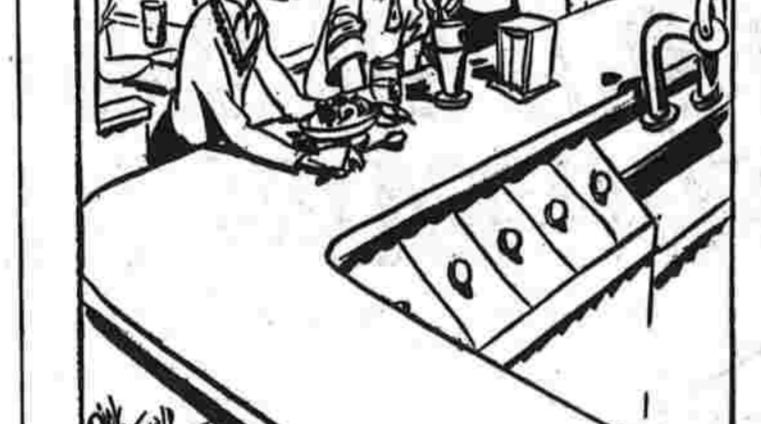
