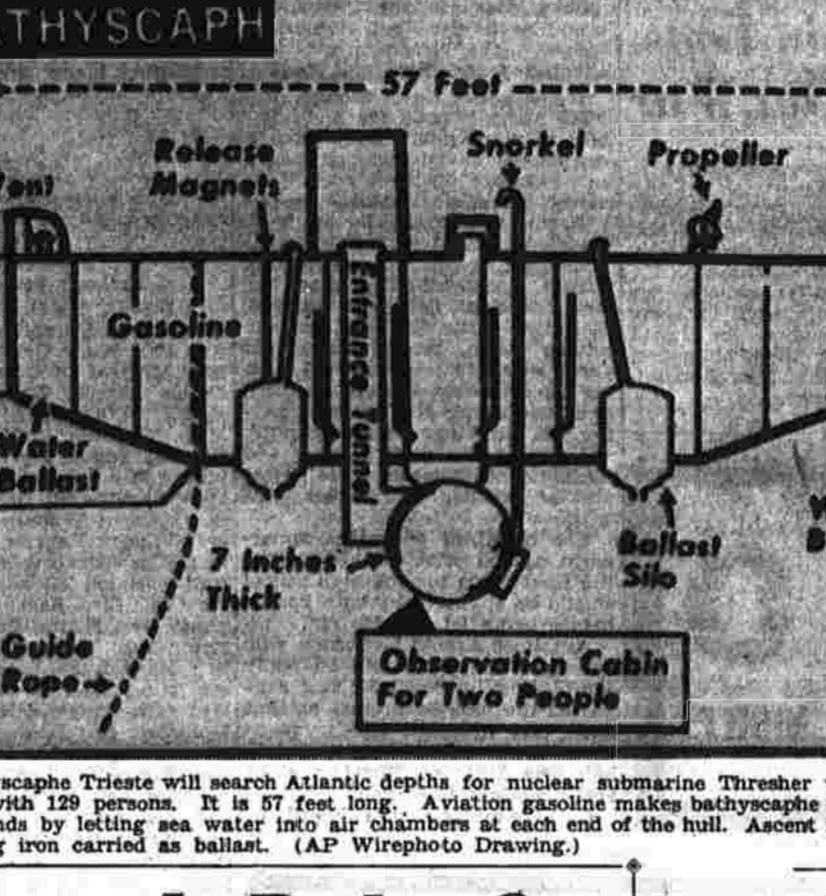

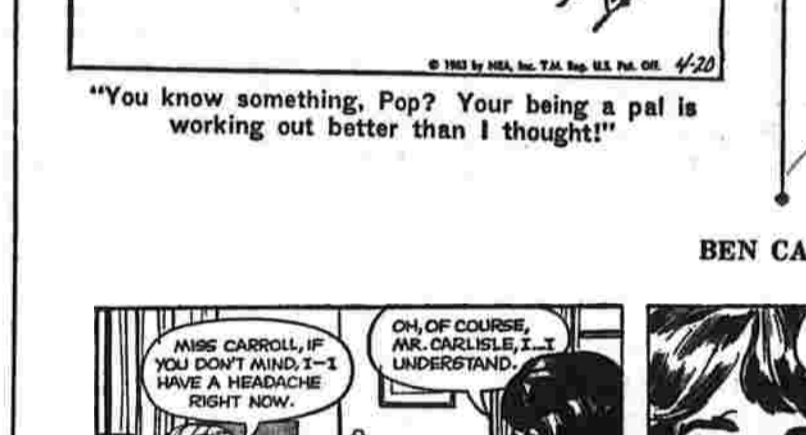
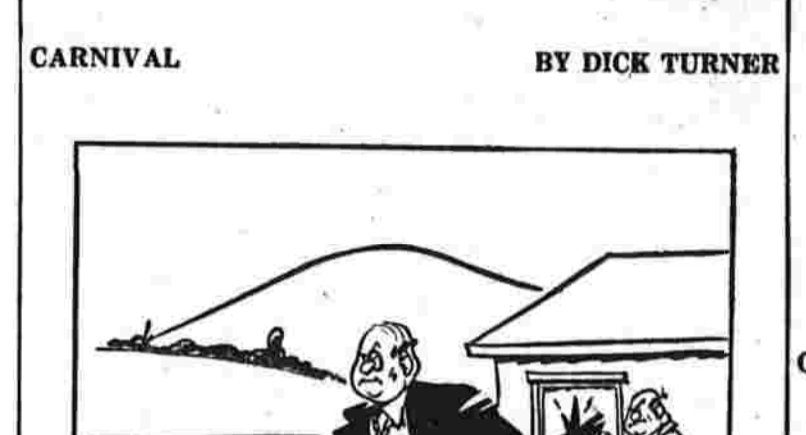

Robert Q. Likes Work, Public's Glad He's Back

"The busiest man in television," is what they called Robert Q. Lewis three years ago. Then abruptly in 1961 he vanished, not to be seen again on the networks until last fall when he stepped in as guest emcee for "Play Your Hunch" colorcast 10:30 a.m. Monday through Fridays on NBC.

fine; do you think it is X, Y or Z?" One of the best performances in the business, was back in business. If you, with a few million others, wandered through his New York City town house via the old "Person-to-Person" television program, you'll remember that here was a man who looked too rooted ever even to dare calling the moving man. "All of a sudden, I found," he says, "I was over-exposed." One by one producers decided to give his face a rest, until they were all giving him a rest.

"And so you went to California to think?"

"Wrong again," grins the genial, horn-rimmed Robert. "I went because the only job offered me was a four-hour daily disc jockey show in Hollywood, and I was grateful for it, so I took it. I like to be busy. . . I like to have somewhere to have to go everyday."

And so, New York born Robert Q sold his New York town house. At a loss? Well, no. It seems he made money. And the record collection and some of the sculpture? Likewise.

Brave of him to pack up and start anew you say. "Smart and lucky," he counters. "I didn't realize what I'd been missing. I'm a sun worshipper anyway (and with his tan he certainly can't be making much work for the makeup man) so I bought a new house in the country surrounded by sunshine and a swimming pool . . . and now I think of California as home!"

"Play your Hunch" originates in New York so he's set himself up in a small new apartment "but the suana bath really isn't a substitute for a swim, and I like exercise."

"Play Your Hunch" is doing much better in his affections than his old home town. Obviously he enjoys the show enormously himself. It's a perfect vehicle for his sometimes zany, always polished, humor. He was one of the first entertainers to kid a commercial successfully without getting so carried away he'd put a sponsor out of business.

"We have scope too," he says. "There latitude enough for me to sing an occasional number of the type I like; you know 'Barney Google,' and 'America Admires You, President Harding.'"

The "three guesses," a theme that recurs in Arabian Nights stories and Goodson-Todman shows is the sure-fire basis of "Hunch." The only fixed elements, in fact, are that the opposing panelists are inevitably husbands and wives. Robert Q. ventures that he would like to see this extended. He'd especially like to see an occasional grandchild-grandfather combination. "I love to work with children. We need good fibers and children are, because they have the imitation." Then he got definitely serious and added "Imagination is a quality that should be fostered. Don't lose sight of the fact that imagination helped make this country great."

Newspaper Enterprise Assoc. NEW YORK — (NBA) — The much publicized change in Pat Boone's screen image isn't quite as drastic as you might think.

Although he plays "a moral bankrupt" in the coming "The Main Attraction" and "a complete heel" in the coming "The Yellow Canary," Boone insists that there is more to this than meets the eye.

"I had become somewhat stereotyped," Pat says, in the understatement of the year. "But I don't want to change my image, just add a new facet."

And so he accepted these two roles, a far cry from the pink-cheeked parts which had marked his movie career in the beginning. Yet the two roles are not all bad; they have one thing in common which, in Pat's mind, makes them worthwhile parts.

"In 'The Main Attraction,' " he says, "the man I play is an amoral drifter and vagrant, a moral bankrupt. But then he gradually falls in love with Nancy Kwan and the love changes him. The story teaches the value of love."

"I'd never play a complete rat. The story has to be worthwhile and say something I believe in. Anthony Quinn and John Casavetes suggested that I play Bobby-Baby in the movie version of 'Tchin-Tchin.' But I wouldn't—the character is no good and the story doesn't say anything worthwhile."

So Pat can reconcile his playing of heels—if the heel changes and if, in the changing, the story makes a point he believes in.

"I want to make wholesome movies," he says. "And, at the

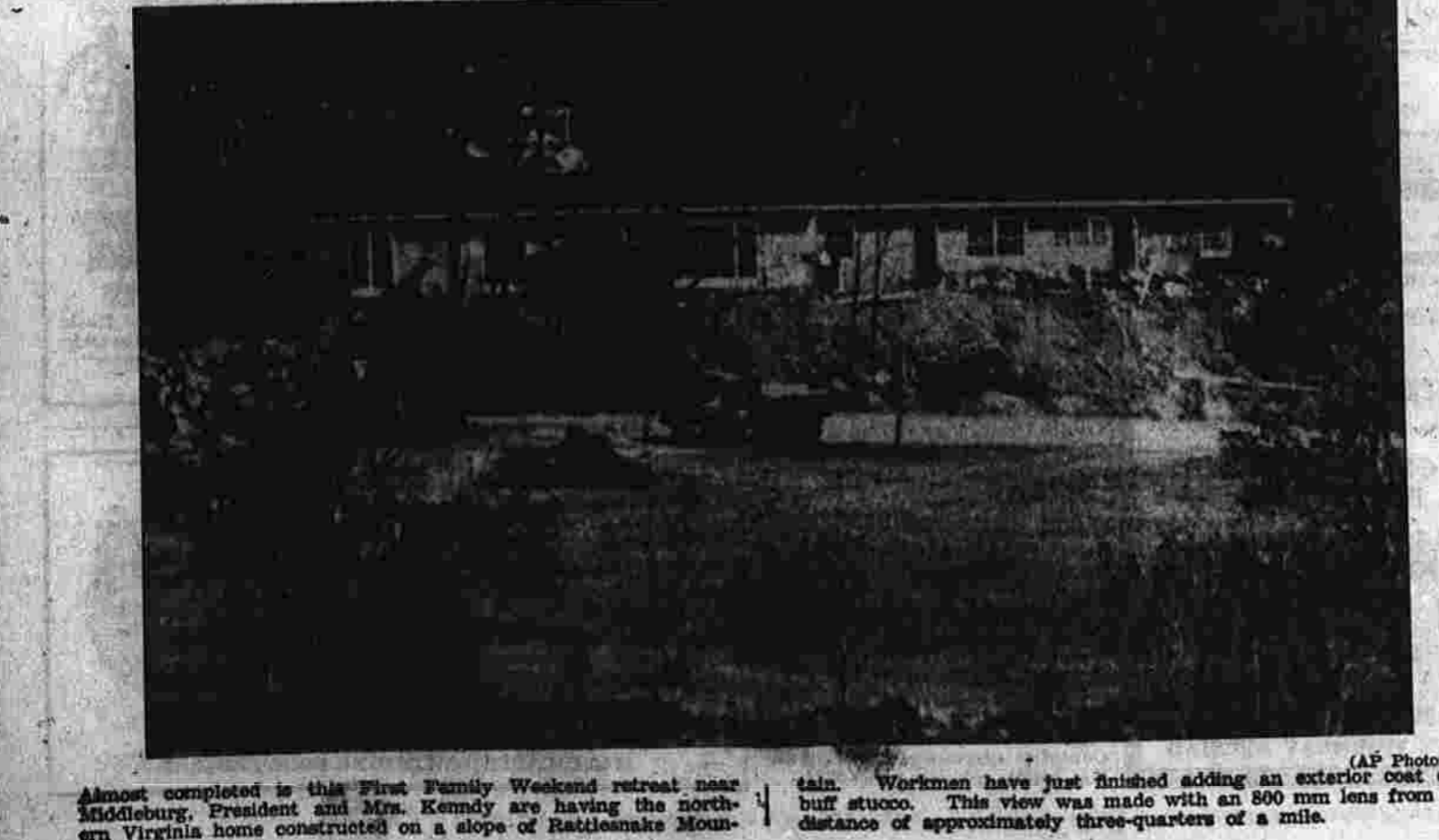
