## Spain Shoots Franco Enemy

France's government announced today that Spanish Communist leader Julian Grimau Garcia was executed at dawn, despite a clemency appeal from Soviet Premier Khrushchev.

The terse announcement by the Ministry of Information gave no detalls. It came nearly two hours after Grimau's defense attorney, Amindino Hodrigues Armanda, and police sources said the Red leader had been shot by a firing squad.

Police informants said Grimau was quiet and composed as he went before the firing squad in the courtyard of Carabenchel prison.

Grimau, convicted of military terrorism during the Spanish civil war, refused both confession and hour communion, the informants said. Nevertheless a priest stood by.

British Labor party member of Parliament John Mendelson said "It was the worst miscarriage of justice in many years."

The firing squad was manned by troops of the "Wad Ras" regiment from Spanish Morocco, the sources said.
