

This is the substance of many rulings that town counsels have given over the years, based on study of the town's charter.

Since the director of public works and the general manager are the same — the public works department is headed by a deputy director — it has been the practice for the manager to appoint architects, usually in concert with the department heads for whom the building is being undertaken.

In the past, the manager has discussed possible choices with a joint committee of town govern-

Architects for schools have been selected after the manager has conferred with representatives from the building committee, the board of education, and the board of directors.


One method, Crandall says, that the committee members might participate in selection, would be to arrange interviews with prospective candidates for town work. The committee would then reconstitute above to the general of directors.


