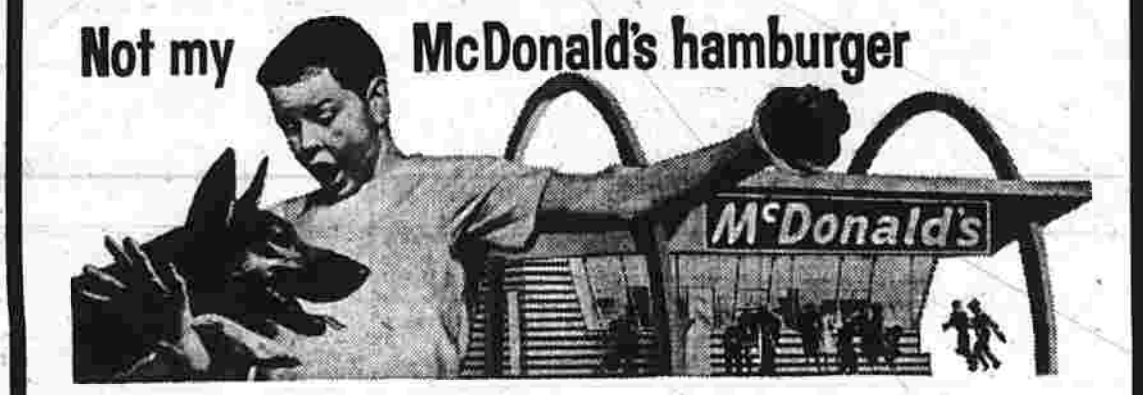

Specific Rules Sought For Labels, Packaging

 WASHINGTON (AP)—Hot controversy boils over this question: Do Congress need to pass another law to keep American housewives from being deceived by the packaging and labeling of products they buy in today's marketplace?

Sen. Philip A. Hart, a midwestern Democrat from Michigan, contends such a law is much needed—and a bill he has introduced has brought the question into sharp focus.

The Senate's Republican leader, Everett M. Dirksen of Illinois, denounced the bill as "just another harassment of industry."

Hart calls his bill a "truth-in-packaging" measure. He says it is designed to make sure that manufacturers of foods and other household products compete on the basis of price and quality—rather than packaging gimmicks and deception.

Dirksen, senior GOP member of the subcommittee, argues that present laws give federal regulatory agencies simple authority to protect consumers against deceptive practices.

This also is the view taken generally by industry spokesmen of the bill which has the endorsement of the Kennedy administration.

At stake in the dispute are many household items on which American consumers spend about \$70 billion a year.

The bill is the outgrowth of an investigation begun by the Senate Antitrust subcommittee about two years ago with Hart presiding.

Hart says he first got interested in the subject because of gripes by his wife and women employees in his office.

Extensive hearings were conducted recently. In a statement at the wrap-up, Hart cited what he termed "irrefutable testimony" that the packaging and labeling revolution of the past decade had resulted in competitive practices that are bad for the economy, bad for the businessmen and bad for the consumer.

What are the complaints? They include protests about package blubs such as "ten cents off regular price;" odd shapes and sizes of packages; fractional weights and measures; uses of terms like "limbo" and "super," which may be misleading; and statements of net weight or contents in small type and in colors that blend with the package and are hard to find.

There was much testimony that a housewife would have to equip herself with a slide rule and measuring glass if she hoped to select the best buy among the vast array of goods on market shelves.

But industry witnesses said the housewife was being undercut. They said also that manufacturers know they are compelled by the law of survival to please the customer.

Furthermore, they said the ingenuity of American industry in responding to the shift from the corner grocery store to the super-

The GOP victory followed a similar Republican sweep of state legislative and county offices here last fall.

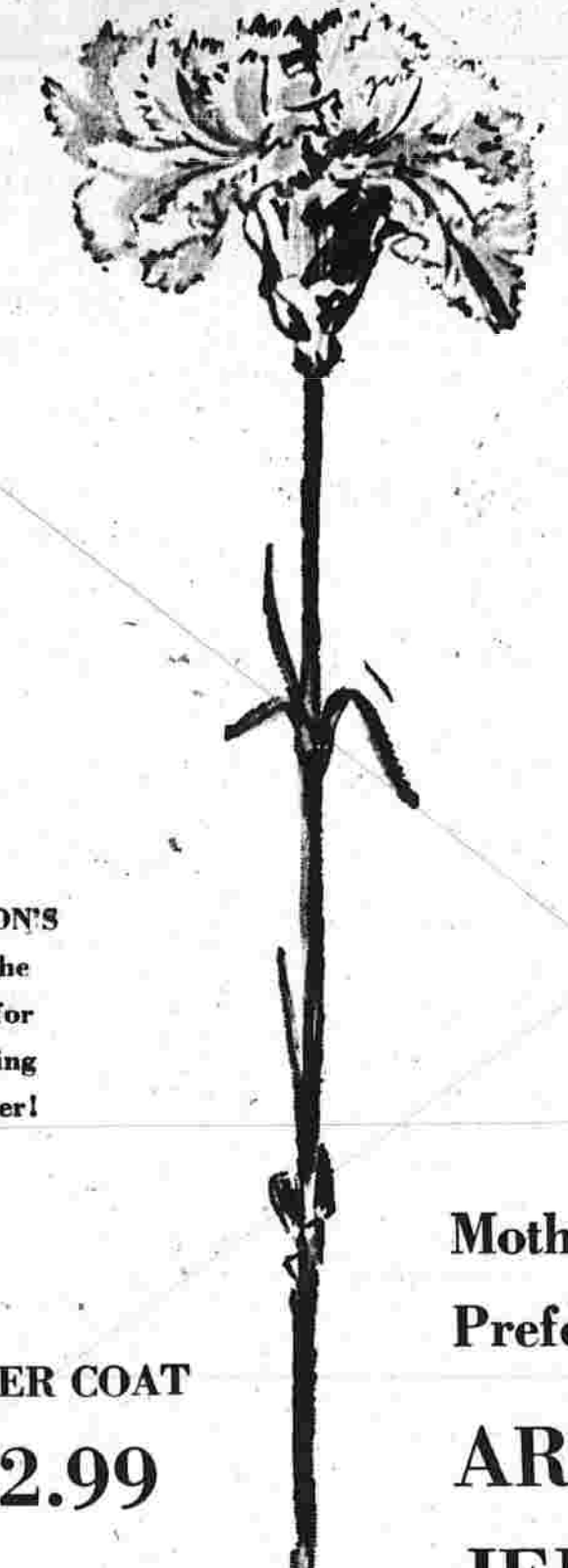

OVERLY DEVELOPED FEARS—TOO MUCH OF A GOOD THING
By Wayne G. Brandstedt, M.D.

Everyone is afraid of something. The newborn shows fear of loud noises and of suddenly being dropped. These are instinctive fears.

Other fears develop as the child grows. He must, of course, be taught useful fears, such as fear of fire or careless handling of sharp objects. This can be done without actually burning or cutting him, as a few misguided parents have done.

Because of his natural dependence on his mother, the infant of about 2 may develop a marked fear of separation from her, and may make a great fuss whenever she must leave him.

This is seen in its worst form when the mother has had to be separated from him unavoidably for several days. Memory of this may contribute greatly to his fear of going to bed. In such a case it is better to leave his bedroom door open and leave a dim light on if he wants it.

Frightening stories of television programs are often a factor in aggravating fear of personal catastrophe or death. I have just received a letter from a mother whose 8-year-old daughter has developed such a horror of death that she doesn't want to grow up.

Her ideas should be listened to and treated matter-of-factly. If the child is kept busy and if her interest in the wonderful world she doesn't want to leave is stimulated, she will gradually overcome her fears.

"It's like being reborn again," she told an interviewer.

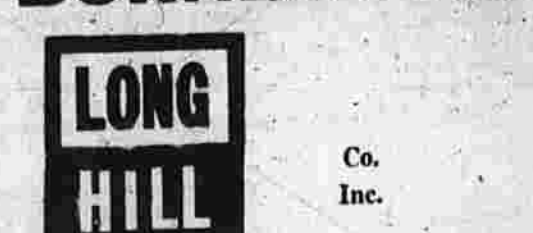

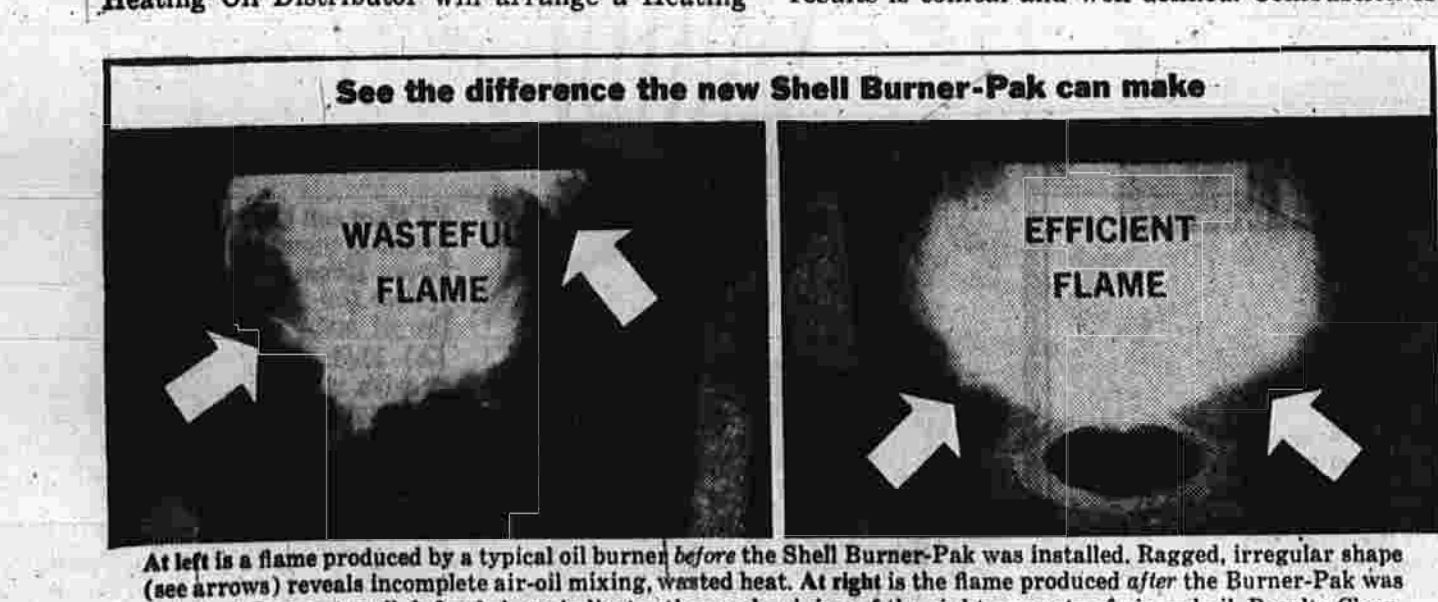

Town Gives Up Land For Westhill Addition

Town directors acted last night toward removing a restriction on 17 1/2 acres of land adjacent to Westhill Housing for the elderly so that the land can be used as the site for 100 additional housing units.

The town board voted 7-1 last night to rescind the restriction on the land for use as a park for the Westhill residents. The deed specifies that it can be used for recreational purposes only.

Democratic Director Richard Woodhouse, said the project would cost \$1,490,000 and will involve about six months of planning and several months of reviewing plans before construction.

He said the authority has enough applications from senior citizens "to fill it twice."

Sweeper Rent Bid Waived by Board

The board of directors last night waived the requirement of bids to rent an additional street sweeper. The waiver was requested by Deputy Director of Public Works Chester Langtry, who said the additional sweeper has been rented for \$20 per hour, and the expense must be kept under \$1,000.

That would allow the town to have the rented equipment for one to two weeks.

Board members agreed that the added sweeper will help the town clean sand from the roads earlier this year, and it should be retained as long as needed, General Manager Richard Martin said the job.

Two Want Dump Closed Sundays

Two West Side residents last night asked the board of directors to consider having the town disposal area closed on Sundays.

Joseph Botteolio, 77 Spencer St., and John Gaudino, 99 Spencer St., said they are bothered by sea gulls and the odor of refuse on Sundays. They said the dump itself is extremely busy on weekends.

Botteolio said he would like to have coconuts in the summer, but cannot have them unless the disposal area were closed. Spencer St. is located behind the disposal area.

Gaudino suggested that the board vote to have the area open longer daily to compensate for Sunday closings.

Reader Appointed To Charter Unit

Leonard E. Reader, 116 Constance Dr., was appointed a member of the Charter Revision Commission last night by the board of directors.

A Democrat, he replaces Jerome Nathan, also a Democrat, who has resigned from the newly organized committee.

An official of the Green Manor Construction Co., Reader is a former member and chairman of the Town Development Commission.

The directors last night accepted the resignation of Democrat Harry Horroff from the building committee, and tabled action on a replacement.

Philosophers To Help Staff Salk Institute

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP)—The Salk Institute for Biological Studies is under construction as a center for research in the field of cancer and the genetics of the Pacific coast to rest and rally to its work.

Situated atop Torrey Pines Mesa, the institute will tower above a grove of gnarled dwarf pines which cling to the face of a crumbling, yellowish sandstone cliff.

The Torrey pines range downward to a deep ravine where morning sea fog frequently drifts in to cloak their haunting shapes.

The spot has attracted attention notably a group of millionaires who lived with Dr. Jonas Salk for 11 years.

They offered to pay \$25 million for a 99-year lease of the property and intended to convert it into an executive golf course. Salk, who is man for the group told the San Diego City Council "Top notch people have been looking for the site of the finest golf course in the world."

Typically, Dr. Salk took no part in public discussion of contending proposals for use of the 43-million plot of land and eventually it was awarded to his sponsor—the National Foundation.

Dr. Salk, who developed the anti-polio vaccine 10 years ago, has been known as a hermit since the site "Utopia." But in an interview he said he hadn't.

The institute will be a \$15-million plant with two deluxe laboratories.

Dr. Salk's aides said some of the students will start work in a temporary laboratory at the site within three months.

Later on, philosophers, biologists of science and others will join the staff.

Research at the institute will be unhampered by pressure. There will be no grants, contracts, or to develop a particular thing, such as an atom bomb.

Dr. Salk at present is experimenting with viruses and predicts that it will one day be possible to control as many as 100 diseases with a single, over-all antiviral vaccine.

"The way to fight cancer is to immunize man from all viruses that affect him," he said. "It may be a shotgun approach but it may be the only way."

On the road to such a discovery, however, it is possible that the very roots of nature will be tapped with far-reaching effects.

For instance, scientists probing the biological nature of man could turn up a method of altering personality patterns, or possibly a contribution to the mental and spiritual well-being of man.

But such a discovery, if it falls into the laps of fortune, could sound the death knell for some of the most cherished values of Western civilization.

"Your focus is prospective, you are looking ahead to discover what might happen—what might be new," he said. "Mine is perspective—looking at what has gone before."

There is no answer to your question at present," he added. "That is why historians and philosophers will be at the institute."

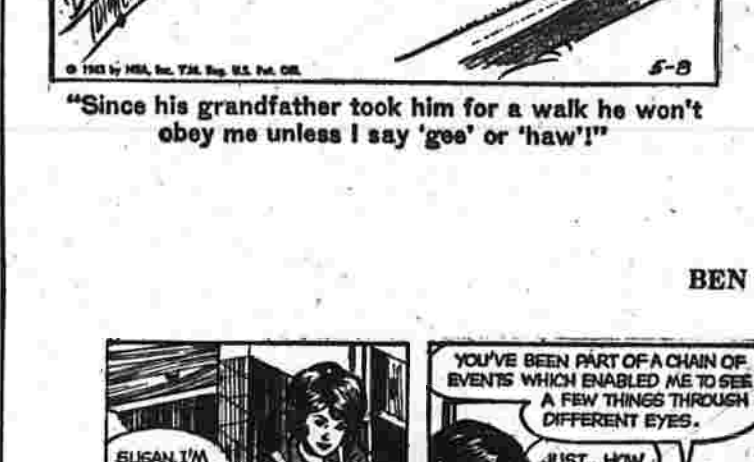
