Shea Says Democrats Passed Phony Budget

The fiscal 1968-64 budget "is one of the phoniest budgets ever adopted in this town," Atty. John F. Shea Jr., Republican town chairman, charged last night. "The people shouldn't be fooled by any one-mill tax increase," he said, because if the Democratic majority plans to fulfill its campaign promises it will have to make up the shortages by bonding heavily.
