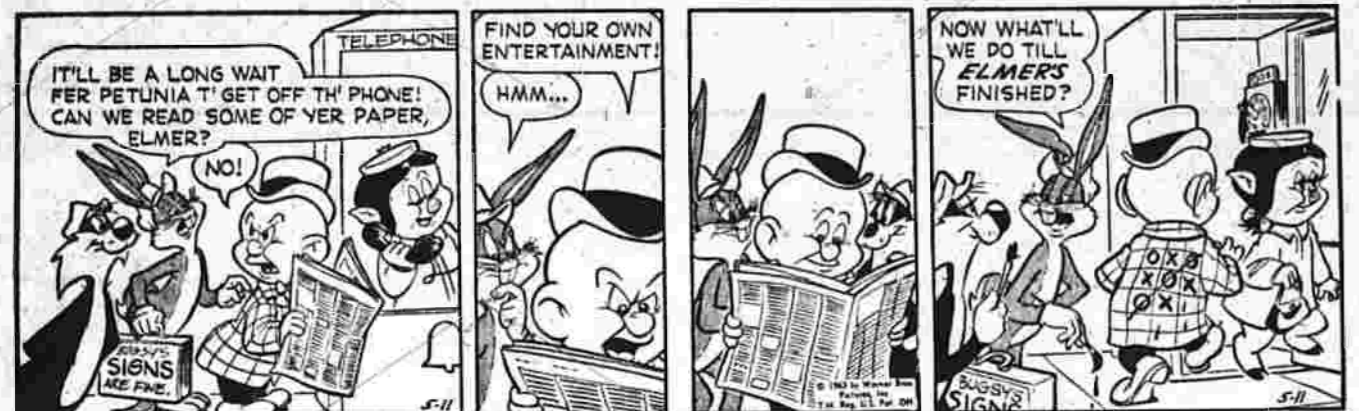

# Jack Linkletter Host On Hootenanny Show

"And then I learned it's highly infectious," said Jack Linkletter who was speaking not of some new virulent virus but of folk music. He had just finished explaining he'd been signed as emcee of ABC-TV's Saturday night "Hootenanny" (8:30 p.m.) partly because of his age (25) and partly because he wasn't a "folknik." The famous Art's suave eldest son elaborated further. "The producers felt I would try to find out what it's all about and then translate it—in terms they'll understand—to viewers, who, like myself, are newcomers to folk music. To the real insiders, you see, it's a small world of almost religious dedication. My role is not that of a moldier but rather that of an interpreter."

"Before I started doing the show, I knew by reputation only a few folk performers. I was no buff then; but I certainly am now."

"Theodore Dikel and I stopped by 'The Bitter End' in Greenwich Village last night. Everybody joining in. You should have seen the crowd there go for the Smothers Brothers." The limelights he added, were on hand, too. All of them have appeared on "Hootenanny"; in fact all that was lacking was a college campus. (Schools visited by Jack and name guests at last reports included the University of West Virginia, George Washington University, Penn State, Brown, Michigan and Rutgers.)

"Why did I sign for the show? Well for one thing I give about a third of my time to broadcasting and I've been looking for a night-time show. My three previous series were daytime. Then, too, I'm still going to collapse myself... working for my master's degree in business education at UCLA. But most important of all, from my point of view, is the mobility of the show. Though my father and I disagree on this, mobility is a concept I believe in. I feel it is more meaningful for viewers."

"I built the first mobile television truck, you know and used it extensively for the old 'On the Go.' In fact I think I hold the record for remote television origination."

We'd caught up with Jack, (who'd touched down briefly be-

tween college hops to transact business in New York) over breakfast at the Savoy-Hilton. "If my wife were here I wouldn't have to be making this decision myself," he muttered to the menu before bracing himself to order grapefruit, chipped beef on toast and "skinny milk," as he calls skim milk. Trying to hold down his weight? Not at all, he just loves skim milk. Always did. "For cereal I sometimes pour on ordinary milk. To me that tastes rich and creamy," he commented. Does his wife, the former Barbara Hughes, ever travel around with him? Well not nowadays. With three small children (Michael, 5; Dennis, 3; and Laura, 1) and a fourth expected in October she's sticking pretty close to the couple's Brentwood, Calif., home.

Jack, I had heard from the West Coast, has developed quite a reputation for himself as a radio interviewer; he had a daily program on the ABC-West Network. What does all this "Hootenanny" travel do to that? "As I told you," he smiled, "I believe in mobility." He pointed to the tan leather case on chair beside him, "eight pounds of tape recorder of such fidelity that I even caught the comments of a landing parachutist with it. I do programs wherever I go."

"What's this difference of opinion between you and your father on what makes a good show?"

"It's pretty much my mobility concept again. Dad finds a stage and audience stimulating. He feels it's more spontaneous. I've been developing my style along different lines. You see, I feel the person being interviewed is most himself in his own environment. For example, if I'm interviewing a man who's landed on Skid Row because of alcohol, I go see him on Skid Row. Incidentally, I feel no subject need be taboo if it's handled with taste. I think people have come to expect more depth. It makes things more interesting for viewers and listeners."

"What it boils down to is that Dad and I are after different things. His is the performer's point of view. It's right for him."

There's plenty on which he and his Dad do agree, though, and big business is one of them. Though he's still after that degree, Jack could teach the course. He's already proven himself a shrewd and competent business man. In fact, he is now general manager for most of the vast Linkletter enterprises of his father's which include ranching in Australia, bottling firms, construction franchising, produce farms, management services, many more.

"I'm a business man two-thirds of the time, you see," he clarified, "and a show business personality one-third of the time. The yardsticks are different. Business is both tangible and creative; I love it. In show business, on the other hand, your own efforts are not necessarily the molders of your future. I consider myself most
