School Board **Lists Factors** For Jr. High

With the town due to vote tomorrow on appropriating \$10,000 to plan a junior high school, the board of education has listed 36 points in favor of establishing the program in the town's school system. Voting will take place from noon to 6 p.m. at Wapping School.

Junior high schools, the board says, are not new—the first one was established in 1910; by 1950, 75 per cent of all secondary schools in the netter was reserved. the nation were on some form of junior-senior high plan; and in Commecticut, two-thirds of the school population are now on some form of junior high plan.

The board says better provision can be made for individual differences by bringing together enough pupils to make class groups anough pupils to make class groups workable. The town is limited pupils in each school on each de omental level to allow matisvelopmental level to allow satis-factory grouping.

Curriculum offerings can also
be strengthened in a junior high,
the board claims. "In a junior
high," the board says, "you can
more readily, satisfactorily and
economically, offer foreign language, science, mathematics, shop,
home economics, music, art and
typing."

typing."
The board notes that special help can be given slow learners, honors courses can be offered to the gifted, and remedial help can be given under the junior high system. system.

Library facilities could be provided that are not now possible in the four schools serving the town; special facilities for science, language, art, music and athletics would also be possible.

The board also found that pupils in a junior-high program tend to remain longer in school, noting that a six-year study in Schenectady of their 40-year-old junior high program showed a drop-out rate of 15% compared with a state average of 35%. The board also says there are fewer failures and less retardation in a junior high program.

Finally, the board notes, "The proposed accreditation program of the state contains at least two equirements which we could not meet under our present 8-4 plan.

Students in Mr. Anthony C. All-brio's honors physicz class have re-cently completed their major term projects. Climaxing two and a half months of work, the 20 seniors brought their projects to class, ex-plained them, and handed in writ-ten accounts of their findings.
