"Secondly, we'll have more re-hearsal time through this device. One week I may have a small part —I'll only be on camera for one scene that takes one day to shoot. The rest of that week I can be re-hearsing for a bigger part the next

"On most shows, the actors get one day of rehearsal. This way, we'll get four or five." Boone says he's been "fiddling" with this idea for four years, and "trying to sell it" for three. CBS turned it down, but NBC said yes

quickly.

He has already assembled 11 of the 14 performers he wants for his company. He used two criteria for picking them—the range of parts they could play and "ther emotional compatibility."
