Remember when it was said there were only three cities in the United States where a man could get a decent meal—New York, New Orleans and San Francisco? Remember when ketchup was the all-American food, because it was used from coast to coast to cover up culinary horrors? It was the only thing that tasted the same everywhere—but it took a strong man to shake it out of the strong man to shake it out of the

Only a generation ago the well-equipped motoring tourist needed a stomach pump as much as a tire pump. He didn't need to climb a mountain to find adven-ture. All he had to do was stop at a roadside Bide-a-Wee or Dew Drop Inn—and order the blue

A gastronomic map of America would have shown it to consist largely of a vast desert-where the natives took revenge on pass-ing strangers by insisting that they partake of local grub. Each region had developed its own way of ruining good food.

In New England they boiled a piece of meat until it disintegrated. In the South they tossed it into a kettle of boiling lard until it gave up and sank.
